Mexican collectors are just now very anxious to exchange stamps of their country for those of Uncle Sam's. Mexican stamps are good investments, and are sure to raise in value before long.

One year ago it was impossible to sell the one and two cent Columbian at any price. At last the tide has turned and there is some demand for even these common stamps.

It does not pay to sell stamps in bulk without looking them over. Recently a philatelist in western Ohio took a box full of old stamps

to a dealer and offered them in exchange for two dollars worth of foreign stamps. Among the lot the dealer found a number of unperforated U. S. revenues worth several times the amount given.

Philatelic Facts for February received. It's fine. It contains some good notes and editorials. The March number, though smaller, contains four or five good articles.

Badger Philatelist is again a double number for January-February. "A Philatelic Badge" is one of the articles, and it also contains many other notes.

W. Gellschopp & Co's price-list for 1896 is very neat, and contains 48 pages and cover.

The Diamond Philatelist for February received. It contains an excellent article by H. F. Beaumont, Jr., entitled "A New Stamp-issuing Country."

The Midland Philatelist for February contains a good article by Phil A. Telist, entitled "The Days Gone By."

Owing to lack of space we cannot review all papers received. Some of them are: Fireside, Penn., Stamp, Baby Phil. etc.

The dollar values of the '94 set of U. S. stamps have become rarities. In the first place there were but 35,046 of the \$1 value issued; 10,027 of the \$2 denomination, and only 6,251 of the \$5 stamps. Thus we see there were more of the \$1 Columbian stamps printed than of all these three values together. Not only this, but many of each value have been returned by postmasters on account of poor perforations and other defects, and destroyed; however it is safe to state that of those not so destroyed, nearly every copy has, or will eventually fall into the hands of some philatelist. It is also stated that the \$1 value was in use but nine months. Scott prices the three stamps unused in his 56th at \$2, \$4 and \$8 respectively. In the watermarked series the watermark is so hard to distinguish with any certainty that many collectors who do not specialize in minor varieties of U. S. stamps will give up the idea of obtaining a specimen of each set and be satisfied with a stamp of each value, irrespectively of the watermark. The only sure way we have been able to determine the watermark, is by the plain marginal strip on each sheet of stamps, in which the watermark can be easily seen. An inducement to collect plate numbers.—Evergreen State Philatelist.

As long as you can get cheap stamps to fill up don't trouble yourself with dearer varieties or shades watermarks, etc., as you can be more easily swindled when you do not understand them as collectors who have several thousand in their collections.

Never be afraid to invest your spending money in filling up the blank spaces in your album for you are not throwing away your money, but on the contrary, you are investing it in something that you can always get its value for if you wish to sell and that will steadily raise in value.

Never think you can buy from 10c to \$1 unused foreign stamps for from 1 to 10c. Stamps offered in this way are mostly Seebecks.


