Kindle the Fires of Friendship

Misunderstandings often cause heartaches. How many of us realize what a vast number of lives could be made brighter and the hearts that could be gladdened if we all were more free to speak a cheering word here and to send a note of encouragement there.

How many times well intended words or actions of ours are taken in a different spirit than we wish them to be taken. Under such circumstances a personal message of good will—just a note or postcard will smooth over the threatened break of friendship. Most of us talk and write too little. Many a boy leaves home and causes his mother anxiety because he doesn't write her an occasional note or letter. Relatives are very frequently not the friends they should be, simply because they do not communicate freely with each other.

An elderly lady went to a well-known hospital in Chicago for a surgical operation. After the operation she made little progress toward recovery. The days and weeks seemed almost interminable to her. A few postcards were received by the patient each day. The cheering messages they brought made her affliction seem lighter. One morning the nurse brought her patient enough cards to fill a small-sized album. The lady's friends, knowing the effect the cards would have, showered her with a half hundred or so. Apparently the postcard shower saved the patient's life. They gave her encouragement and made her determined to win in her effort to regain her health.

Many dark hours are brightened, many fond memories revived, and many hearts brought closer together by the exchange of postcards. They are always convenient for us, especially when one has a supply of them in the home, and they can be obtained for every occasion—Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Years, Easter, etc. Birthday and greeting cards often-times enable one to send remembrances that would otherwise be overlooked. The message of the postcard may be brief, but its beautiful picture or artistic decoration con-

veys a meaning that cannot be reduced to writing.

The postcard is easily preserved and can be shown to advantage in an album. One is able to collect them at a special place in the world. Thus they may be used as an educator as well as an expression of sentiment.

Let us then increase the sum total of the world's happiness by freely expressing our good will toward our relatives and friends.

Notes on U. S. Stamps.

There are twelve stamps in the new series of United States issued for parcels post use, of the following denominations, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 50, 75, and \$1.00, and of the following designs: Transportation of mail, pony express, railway, steamship, automobile, aeroplane, postal employes at work, railway mail clerks, letter carriers, rural route and industrial scenes.

The approved designs for the San Francisco exposition stamps, which we understand are to be placed on sale early in next year, are 1c green (Balboa), 2c carmine (Gatun locks), 5c blue (Golden Gate).

The 2c carmine postal savings official mail envelope is getting scarce. Six months ago we were offered several lots of several hundred in a lot. They are only offered now by the score.

Most of the 50c and \$1.00 postal savings stamps come with bar or smudge cancellation. These in nice, lightly cancelled condition are a good buy.

Some Market Indications

In a lot of 12,000 Nicaragua stamps received the other day there were but four 6c sepias of the 1912 permanent set. Want lists to six stamp-firms in America are returned with notation "not in stock."

The "Centenario of la Insurreccion," of 1911, Salvador, wuld network are scarcer than their list price would signify. A Central American correspondent, who is in touch with large accumulators of Salvador stamps writes us that "In one lot of several hundred of the 1911 issue only 7 per cent of the stamps were water-marked." Yet the unwatermarked varieties are the higher priced.

Lays in the Iceland Jan Sigurdsson embossed stamps now. Some values are unobtainable, the 6, 15 and 25a are no longer furnished in sets sent from this country.

The unsettled conditions in the Balkan states will quicken philatelic interest in these countries.

The Vasco de Gama issue Surcharged Republics have been offered lately in lots of 10,000 sets. Yet they are quoted at prices one would consider rather high.

There seems to be no danger of the United States 2c Columbian getting scarce. We saw one wholesale list quoting a price per 100,000, "special price for larger quantities."

The discontinued stamps of Tripoli and especially the Italian war stamps surcharged "Tripoli" are not easily obtained at moderate price. Several speculators in Italy, Austria and Germany are not selling at any price.

Obtain your Chinese surcharged stamps at once. Thousands of these have been absorbed in America and are being held. Mayhaps the selfish ones will find themselves "taken in," as they were with the Chinese postage due surcharges.

The New Parcels Post

Postmasters are in receipt of significant orders from the postmaster general with reference to the parcels post act which goes into effect January 1, 1913. The bulletin embodies requirements insisted upon in sending out packages by parcels post and they are as follows:

Ordinary postage stamps must not be used for fourth-class matter after January 1, 1913, and all such matter bearing other than distinctive parcels post stamps will be held according to the rules of the department. Neither will parcels post stamps be accepted for the mailing of letters or any matter not in the fourth class.

All parcels must bear the return card of the sender or they will not be accepted for mailing. Also packages in this class will be mailable only at postoffices, branch postoffices, local branch offices, letter offices and numbered offices named by the postmaster.

The needed requirements in carrying out these laws will be furnished by the government and before January 1, every postmaster in the country will be furnished with a copy of the parcels post map indicating the eight zones; the unit of area in which the postoffice is located and the distance on which the parcels post rates are based. There are many difficulties found in the enforcing of these laws and an unusual amount of work is necessitated which will result in the employment of a good many employees throughout the country, but on the other hand the unfair discrimination practiced in this country which required the people of the United States to pay four cents a pound more in the sending of the packages to be governed by the new law than is exacted in other countries will be stopped and in the long run there will be a great amount of money saved.

In speaking of the primary disadvantages which will undoubtedly be encountered in the carrying out of this law a local postmaster said:

"Most people are liable to get mixed up in the use of the stamps and put parcels post stamps on regular matter and ordinary stamps on fourth-class matter and it probably will be a hard matter to educate the public the same as it was with the postal card which requires a 2c stamp. And then in case of the absence of the name on the inside or

outside of the package, it will be sent to the dead letter office, and that is where a lot of them go. Yes, there will be a lot of hard work, but the results will be felt largely in the large cities where they wish to order provisions from other cities, and here alone it will save thousands of dollars."

GLEANINGS

The designs of the new Russian postage stamps to be issued next year in commemoration of the tri-centenary anniversary of the Romanoff dynasty have been completed and placed in the hands of the crown printers. The one-kopek stamp (orange) will bear the portrait of Peter the Great, the two-kopek (green) that of Alexander II., the three-kopek (rose) Alexander III.; the four-kopek (red), Peter I.; the seven and ten kopek (blue), the portrait of the reigning Czar Nicholas II.; the fourteen-kopek (olive), Catherine the Great; the fifteen-kopek (light brown), Nicholas I.; the twenty-kopek (brown), Alexis Mikhailovich; the twenty-five-kopek (olive) Alexander I.; the thirty-five-kopek (dark blue), Paul I.; the fifty-kopek (brown), the Empress Elizabeth Petrovna, and the seventy-kopek (bright green), the portrait of the first Romanoff, Michael Feodorovich. The ruble stamp will bear a picture of the Winter Palace in St. Petersburg.

The Russian postage stamps have never hitherto borne portraits of the czars or czarinas. The process of postal obliteration was deemed derogatory to the dignity of the imperial eagles.—(Philatelic West.)

A Scenic Series Proposed at the Trans-Mississippi Commercial Congress.

That the United States should further the "See America First" campaign by reproducing on the postage stamps views of notable American scenery was one of the recommendations made by Louis F. Hill of the Great Northern Railroad, at Salt Lake city August 29, according to press dispatches.

Because of the three years that will elapse before the Panama-Pacific exhibition it would be no surprise to philatelists if the department should act upon Mr. Hill's recommendation and give us a pictorial set for regular use. Possibly the Panama-Pacific set will be sprung next year to continue three years. Beyond doubt there is something doing in stamps, with the savings bank issue, the parcels post series and general changes everywhere.—(The Stampster.)

The foreign postoffices in Palestine do not live together in a state of brotherly love. There is a keen competition between them. If you take a parcel that exceeds the regulation weight or size to one, it is refused; but if you happen to remark that you will consult a rival postoffice on the point, you are speedily assured that it is unnecessary to do so, and the parcel goes forward without a question.

So keen is the rivalry between these European postoffice that residents in Palestine possess the unique experience of a free post within certain districts. Between Jaffa and the surrounding colonies, and also within Jerusalem, the German and Austrian offices make no charge for local letters. They hope that those thus benefited will patronize the same offices with their other correspondence.—(The Collectors' Journal.)

In your October number you deal with the stamps of Mauritius. A good insight into the importance of this colony is afforded by the arms which appear to best advantage on the jubilee stamp of 1898. The quarterings of the shield represent a sailing vessel and three branches of sugar cane, symbols of overseas commerce and industry, and a key and a star, which lend point to the colony's motto—*Stella Clavisque Maris Indici*—(Star and Key of the India Sea.)
