## COIN NEWS.

The following appeared in a recent number of the "Metropolitan Philatelist." The statement is entirely new to us, and we give it for what it may be worth.

"The government proposes to step in and boom the coin business with an issue of commemorative dollars to be coined in the interest of the Lafayette Monument fund. These dollars are to be issued to the number of 50,000. Four designs for the new coin are under consideration. The first shows on one side of the coin the faces of Washington and Lafayette. Encircling these profiles are the words: 'United States of America. One Dollar.' On the other side is a reproduction of the proposed monument with the inscription: 'In honor of Gen. Lafayette, erected by the youth of the United States. France, 1900.' In the second design the words: 'United States of America. One Dollar' encircle Washington's profile on one side and around Lafayette's on the other are the words: 'Monument to Lafayette. Erected, Paris, France, 1900.' The third design has a profile of Lafayette in center, under which appear the dates, 1757-1834. On the fourth design are the profiles of Washington, Lafayette, Lincoln and Grant. Another design suggested shows the prayer of Lafayette for the United States, artistically engraved. Secretary Gage has not selected the design, but it is understood he favors the obverse of the second with the reverse showing the prayer."

The announcement of the death on April 12th of Ed. Frossard was a great surprise. While it was known he had been ill for several months, no serious consequences were apprehended. He had been so long prominent in numismatic affairs that he will be greatly missed.
