## STAMPS LATELY ISSUED.

**CANTON BERNE.**—A great sensation has lately been caused by the appearance of this stamp, and a great many opinions expressed about its genuineness. We have reason to believe that a large harvest has been made from its sale. Our correspondent in Switzerland, however, writes us, that it is merely a *Local Bill Stamp*. Its colour is buff, with a bear on shield.

**PORTUGAL** has just issued a very pretty stamp. Like the others of Don Luis' reign, it is printed in a bright yellow on white paper.

**PERU.**—This country has changed the colour of its stamps. Instead of the 1 dinero blue, a pink and a red one have been issued each of the value of one dinero. The arms are in a circle in white relief. These stamps are square, and bear the words "Correos Porte franco Correos" in curved ribbons. Filigree work is substituted for the wavy and diagonal lines. We ourselves much prefer the old blue one, and consider it to be much better executed.

### JOTTINGS FOR LAST MONTH.

—

Last month has produced a new Catalogue of nearly 2000 Postage Stamps. It is carefully compiled from various sources, and the information seems for the most part very reliable. The description of the counterfeits after their different countries is a good idea. It is published in Gloucester, and the author (W. H. W.) is "a collector," and, we believe, a contributor to the stamp serials. Mount Brown's fourth

edition was advertised for the commencement of last month, but is only just published.

Amongst the other occurrences of last month, has been the importation of unused Romagnese stamps. Many will doubtless remember that about a year since, unused Schleswig Holstein were imported from abroad, and now somewhat in the same way Romagna are being received by a few dealers, though in smaller quantities than the Schleswig were. Strange to say the 6 bai is found amongst them, a stamp, of which until very lately many collectors doubted the existence. It is said they come from a Swiss dealer, and experience has proved that Italian stamps from Swiss dealers are usually genuine, though few Swiss dealers supply genuine stamps of their *own* country.

Speaking of Romagna, it would seem there were two issues of these stamps, one (the rarest) on slightly glazed paper, the other (the usual sort) on roughish unglazed paper. Amongst other obsolete stamps, of which unused specimens may now be purchased at a moderate rate, are the Monte Video old issue, 60 and 180, the value twice given. They have all the evidence of being genuine too, and can be bought from two or three French and English dealers. Proof impressions of the 60 cent. by Whymper are also now on sale.

"Whymper's series" (as his beautiful proofs on India paper are named) has just received the addition of proofs of the 3 c. Essay, United States, and the blue French Essay perforated in the centre, with the inscription "Laisser flotter, &c.," making the 36th he has engraved for the series.

A London dealer is now selling unused Pacific Steam Navigation Company's stamps at a very low rate. They are barefaced forgeries, very badly executed, and poor in colour, being in fact nothing more than coarse lithographic imitations.

Can anyone give us any reliable information about the somewhat mysterious stamps from Tasma? We may be betraying our own ignorance in asking for it, but so many collectors look upon them as little better than mythical, that we are sure there is room for a full account of them. The price asked for them is very low, considering that they are only just issued, and unused.

We have lately seen a few specimens of a 10 cent. Modena, *violet* (same shade as the 9 B. G.), is this the one which Mount Brown calls 10 c. brown? No one seems to have seen one on brown paper, so perhaps the violet was what he meant to describe.

In conclusion we would warn collectors to be careful that they are not

deceived by any of the fictitious stamps now in circulation, as great numbers of forged stamps came over last month from continental dealers. They were mostly Swiss however, but being well done are rather difficult to detect.

### RARE & OBSOLETE STAMPS.

By J. M. R.

THE PACIFIC STEAM NAVIGATION Co.'s STAMPS.—Comparatively little is known of these very rare and curious stamps. In the first place, it is a well known fact that they are very difficult to obtain, and the fortunate collector has indeed obtained a prize, when he has the good fortune to become the possessor of a genuine one. No catalogue or work on foreign postage stamps, which I have yet seen, has bestowed on them, more than a passing remark. This, I think, is a grand mistake, as they are amongst the rarest, if not the very rarest of postage stamps.

They are used for the transmission of letters and parcels, between the Company's different stations, on the west coast of South America. Though this alone is not the only purpose for which they may be employed; for instance:—If a party in England

put one of them on a letter, for transmission to Peru, by one of the Company's vessels, it would be recognised as post paid by them, or, just the same from the coast to England.

The stamps themselves are very large, having a steam-ship in full sail, in an oval, some sailing to the right, others to the left, according to the issue of the stamp. Their colors are blue, brown, and carmine, and the values  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. 1 reale, and 1 oz. 2 reales, which is on the top and bottom of each stamp. The ozs. represent the weight which the reales will carry.

They are now obsolete, being no longer used by the Company, and the very high price at which they sell, is an inducement for unprincipled persons to strike off a quantity of fictitious ones; but this is no easy matter, for, as simple as they look in make, &c., they are most difficult to forge, and the collector who has once seen the genuine stamps can, at a glance, detect the forged ones.

In the next number of the "LIVERPOOL STAMP ADVERTISER," I shall continue articles under the same head, on rare and obsolete stamps, which I hope will prove not only interesting, but useful to the reader.

**BERLIN**.—We have heard from our correspondent on the Continent, that this city has just issued a local stamp. We have no further particulars, but shall fully treat of it in our next number.

JOTTINGS FOR LAST MONTH.

We have seen the Tasma stamps (?) at last. They belong to a series of labels (whether genuine or not we cannot say, probably not,) about  $2\frac{1}{4}$  by  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches, and are all headed "Pacific Mail Express." The specimens we have seen are as follows:—

All black impressions.

- I. "San Francisco to Los Angeles,"  
"2 reales Paid," on pink paper.  
Do. do. do. white paper.  
Do. do. to "Tasma via  
Mexican Mail," "2 reales Paid,"  
on white paper.
- II. "San Francisco to Los Angeles,"  
"1 oz. 2 reales Paid," on green  
glazed paper.  
"San Francisco to Tasma via  
Mexican Mail," "1 oz. 2 reales  
Paid," do.

The circumstance that the two last are not only on deep crimson, but also on salmon coloured paper, makes us suspicious of them; and they are

so ungainly, that it is scarcely probable they are used for Postal purposes. Can any of our readers give us information concerning them?

The P. S. Nav. Co.'s Stamp noticed in our last, are printed in black, as well as in all colours.

We were (we find) rather too quick in asserting in our last, that two issues of Romagnese stamps had taken place. Since then we have seen the stamps on glazed paper, in which the advocates of that idea place their trust, and we feel sorry they should have been imposed upon by such a palpable forgery. It is very certain the 6 bai was only used for a short time at first: therefore according to the double-issue theory it should have been on glazed paper, (which it is argued was the original issue,) but as it happens, that the 6 bai is on roughish unglazed paper, the theory, that the glazed was the first issue, is untenable.

That source of contention, the double Geneva, (10c. Cantonal and

Local) has again intruded itself on public notice. We hope the enquiry invited may throw so much light upon its antecedents, that it may enable collectors to perceive that it is the unmitigated humbug we have always believed it to be.

Many collectors are of opinion that numbers of the American "Locals" are altogether fictitious. In support of this, we may notice the following among a few, the majority of which are executed in the same rough, unfinished style, and having the same hardness of colour which is so characteristic of the forged Confederate Stamps.

The number of these stamps is so great, that one can hardly believe in them all.

Last month has made the beautifully executed essays of the new Italian Stamps much commoner, they will indeed make a pleasing addition

to the collector's Album should they be issued.

We were sorry to see in the last number of the Boys' Own Magazine, that numerous complaints had been received of several firms who had advertised Stamps. Many collectors had sent to these persons the prices advertised, and received neither answer nor stamps in return. What shews it to have been a regularly organised attempt at swindling, is that the several firms seem to be "aliases" of one dealer. Such proceedings must bring discredit on the whole fraternity of Stamp Collectors. Whilst on the subject of dishonesty amongst dealers, we must say one word against the habit of selling forgeries for genuine stamps. Independent of its dishonesty, the habit is most unworthy of gentlemen, in fact all who do it (and their name is legion) must forfeit all claim to that title. We wish the names of all dealers who make a practice of selling forgeries could be printed monthly in the different magazines, it would soon cause a great diminution of their numbers.

There is a 50 centime French Empire now being sold in London, it is the same colour as the 80c., device the same also. It is well done.

In conclusion we wish to direct the attention of dealers, especially, to an entirely new branch of the Stamp trade, viz.:—*The Debt Recovery*

*Office*," opened in Newport, Mon. As some of our readers may not exactly understand its object, we give the following explanation. Many dealers have, for some time past, desired some means by which their debts might be collected without so much trouble to themselves, as they waste much of their time and money in writing to their debtors. This want has been supplied by Messrs. Stamp & Co.'s scheme of having efficient agents in the different large towns, to call on the parties, and to take the necessary proceedings in case of their refusal to pay

#### RARE & OBSOLETE STAMPS.

**BUENOS AYRES.**—Many collectors who do not know much about the strange bits of paper which it is now all the rage to collect, would perhaps prefer a stamp that is well executed and beautiful in finish to one of an early date and coarsely done, so coarsely, indeed, that but for that useful little book of Mount Brown's, one who has not had much experience in the art would be very much inclined to doubt whether indeed they were stamps at all.

The old Buenos Ayres stamp does not pretend to such excellence as the 12½c. Nova Scotia, or the beautifully finished Ceylon envelopes; but it has more charms in the eyes of the old collector from its extreme rarity than either of the former. See how care-

fully he preserves it, as if it were some rare treasure, and then with the microscope he closely scans every coarsely engraved line to see if it is a genuine specimen.

This stamp has the impression of a steam-ship in an oval frame. The ground-work is very badly executed, in fact altogether it is one of the most roughly executed stamps that we have yet seen. The color differs with the value. The collector may sometimes chance to meet with one of the issue of '59, but it is seldom indeed, even in the largest collections, that one of the first issue is seen.

They are much more eagerly sought after in England than on the Continent, but it is a well-known fact that we could never compete with the Dealers there, in the price of Buenos Ayres and Monte Video stamps. We see several Dealers in England advertise the latter, unused. They appear to be coming in quantities, and have every appearance of being genuine.

**GREAT BRITAIN.**—There are many postage stamps of our own country which are exceedingly difficult to be obtained, but above all the 1d. black, with V. R. in the upper angles. The reason for this is that it was only a stamp used by the Post Office officials in transacting the business which is now done with a common round hand stamp in red ink, containing the words "official paid," date, and name of town.



## STAMPS LATELY ISSUED.

COSTA RICA.—We have this month to announce the issuing of three stamps, by the above named republic. They are of the following value and colors:—

- $\frac{1}{2}$  real, green,
- $\frac{1}{2}$  real, blue,
- 2 reales, scarlet,

and are beautiful in their design and execution. The *design* is a view of two ships sailing to left, one in the foreground, and the other in the distance, separated by a mountainous strip of land, stretching across the ornamental frame in which the whole are enclosed. Above the view, *inside* the frame, are five stars, and *outside* is "*Porte (figure indicating value) Real.*" The inscription, "*Correos de Costa Rica,*" on two ribbons, pendant from a wreath, forms the upper side of the frame, and the value of the stamp in *words* forms its base. Behind the frame are a number of tastefully arranged standards on either side. Its size is a little larger, in every dimension, than our penny stamp. It is perforated, and is on white paper, which has no water-mark. Costa Rica is a small republic at the extreme south of Central America. The state at its extreme north is Nicaragua, which some time since produced a stamp similar to the above, only the view is a landscape, with mountains in the distance.

BERLIN.—In our last we mentioned that this city had issued Express stamps, but that we would give further information in our present number. They are three in number, square with large figure indicating value enclosed in circle. Values are  $\frac{1}{2}$ , 1 and 2 s. gro. They are expressly for the city, and are, we suppose, for the same purpose as the local American.

## Correspondence.

To the Editor of the Liverpool Stamp Advertiser.

SIR,

In your Notices to Correspondents you say you would be obliged for information on the perforation (in the centre) of Western Australian stamps. I met with two 6d. ones (green and purple) and was rather suspicious of the hole in the centres (about the size **O**) particularly as I got them from a shoemaker. The holes had every appearance of being "punched out." Since then I have received another 6d. one, perforated in a similar manner; and I have no doubt that the post office authorities obliterate them in this way. I have also a 1d. one cut into three pieces so regularly that I do not think it can have been done by ruthless fingers with a pair of scissors. The position of the sections is diagonal.

H. A. C. (Devon).—We can do nothing for you in the matter you refer to. We would advise you to put your case into the hands of the proprietors of the "Debt Recovery office," who will guarantee, if possible, the payment of your debt.

ROBERT WILSON.—There are 247 kinds of Local American stamps, according to the 4th edition of Mount Brown.

H. GRIMSHAW.—Thanks for your information. We have already seen the 10c. Belgium perforated, and think that *all* of the Belgium stamps are.

SUBSCRIBER.—The Post Office will not adopt the ½d. postage system, because it would take a far larger number of letter carriers than there are at present. They, however, hope in a few years to do so.
