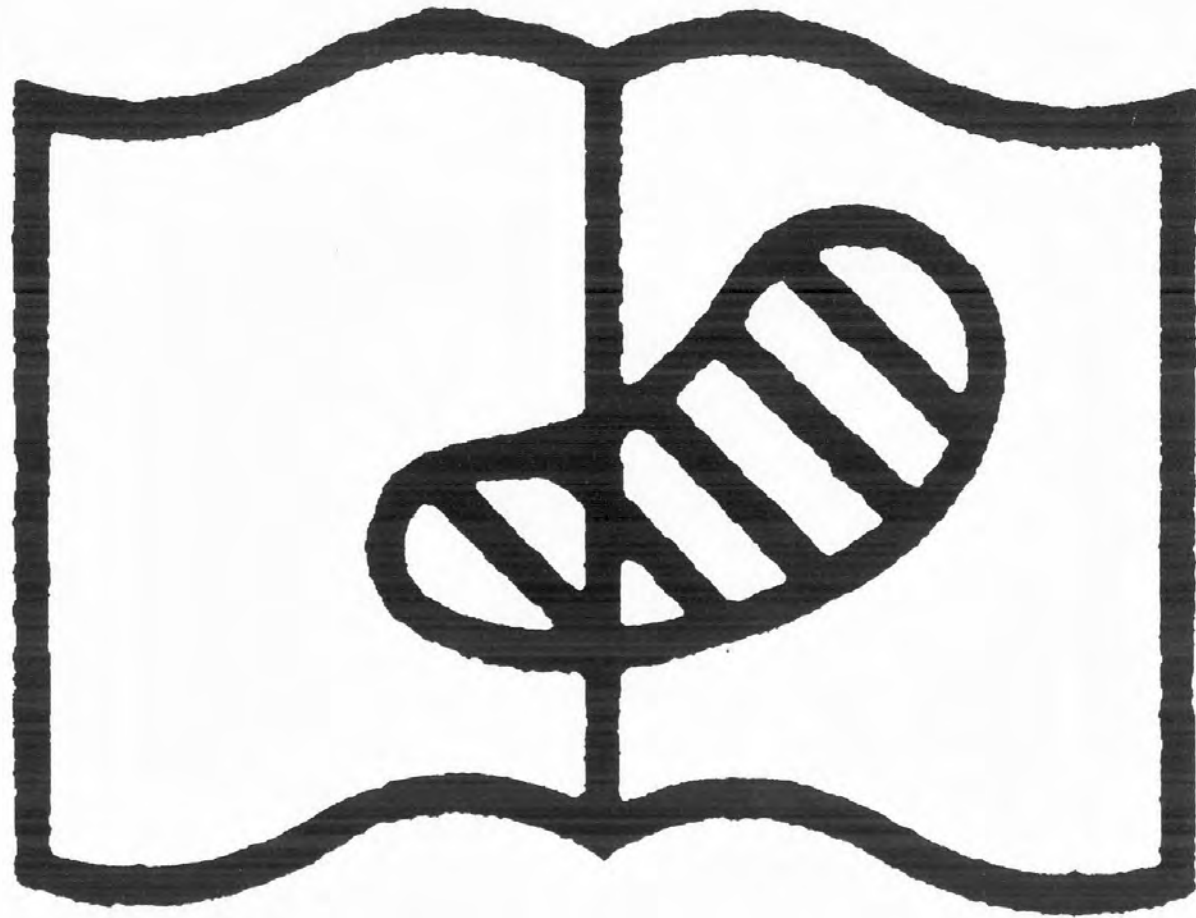

SPECULATIVE ISSUES.

HERE is a great deal of talk in the philatelic press in America by a certain "Society for the promotion of 'Speculative Stamps'". Some think will turn out like the "Anti-Surcharge Society", and will do collectors and editors won't help it along. Philatelists who care for the welfare of Philately at all will want it kept going, and by giving it encouragement by invitation, it ought to and will do a great deal of good.

The last three years unnecessary stamps have been issued in this country since postage stamps came in vogue. If I might permit I could name a few scores of such stamps from all quarters of the globe that have not speculative stamps to drain the collectors' purses. I will only name a few that I think are most prominent: "Zimbabwé", "San Marino Jubilees", "British Colonies", "British Jubilees", "French Colonies", and last but not least, I am sorry to say, "The United States of America".

The "Zimbabwé" stamps only come once a year but we are so poor in this country they should come that often, and if all the postage were worn by printing stamps on the paper and for postage, we would not have to pay for the paper.

San Marino's last set was issued on the completion of a new palace. Our government might well have issued a stamp after the birth of Cleveland's latest daughter (say, for instance, after walking the floor with little Marians, at 11:00 P.M., just stepping on a fish-bone he had dropped, in the day, from one of his renowned fishing trips).

That would have been a good and an excuse for the San Marino government to take.

The Chinese locals are, I think, the worst whole list. One city P.M. had the nerve to add his trash in one of the leading American Juvenile papers, saying: "there would be only a limited number printed, so they may become rare!"

The Jubilee issue of the fiftieth anniversary of Queen Victoria was entirely unexcusable.

The French issued a complete set of 140 values for each of its numerous colonies.

The Columbians were issued for the money would bring as soventers, as the Postmaster general in his report said: "they would yield a profit of \$3,000,000 from the sale to stamp collectors, and \$5 stamps of the 150 set are unnecessary - the quantity used legitimately will not warrant the expense of plates etc."

If these speculative issues keep on coming collectors will have to get only the stamps before or collect the trash nearly every country as they force on the philatelic public.

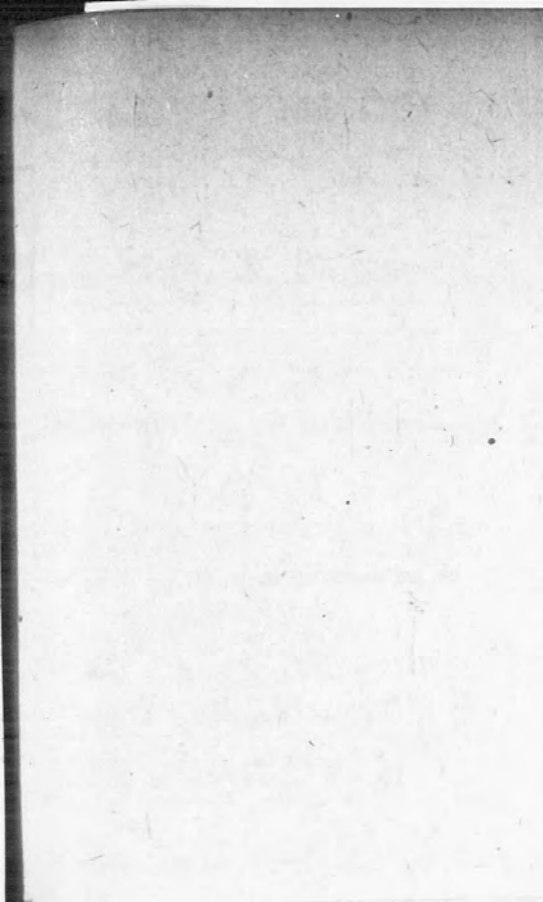
