Mrs. Y. M. McKeand.

During the winter of 1887-8, Crete, Nebr., was the scene of the most clever stamp swindles ever perpetrated in the west. The person who engineered the scheme, though only a young fellow about 18 years of age, showed a talent for crime which would have put to shame an older offender. What the thief's real name was the writer has never been able

to ascertain. During his transactions under his numerous aliases, he probably forgot the cognomen he had received at christening.

In the latter part of 1887 several dealers throughout the United States received applications for stamps of the higher values from a person who signed the name Mrs. Y. M. McKeand, and dated letters Crete, Nebr. As a general thing sheets were promptly forwarded, and the unlucky owners waited in vain for returns. Occasionally the first sheets would be promptly returned the following one being appropriated. By way of varying the monotony, the law breaker sometimes wrote under the names, C. K. Karson, Frank Furgeson, etc. His plan of procedure had not been in operation long, before the dealers whom he had made victims began to complain. Touch a man's pocketbook and you invariably raise an outcry.

At that time the editor was just being heard of as a stamp collector, and inquiries concerning "Mrs. McKeand" soon began to be addressed to him. Repeated investigation failed to discover the name, "McKeand" among those of Crete's citizens however, and the dealers were no wiser than before. Chas. A. Townsend, F. N. Massoth, and others were among the anxious seekers after information.

A few vendors of stamps then wrote to the postmaster asking whether or not the writer had any connection with the gentleman they sought to know. The postmaster's reply set them at rest on that point.

By this time the postoffice inspector had been notified regarding the state of affairs at Crete, but when he arrived on the scene, the bird had flown. How much money he made out of dealers, no one knows. His scheme was unusually successful for one of its sort and must have netted him large returns.

Some of the queer things to be noticed about this month's fraud list are the following: Albert Hayes of Galva, Ill., shows up under a new name, Albert Hayar. Eugene Cross of Beverly, N. J. is reported by both Earl Brothers and Henry S. Harte Wm. M. Long of Montreal, receives an airing at the hands of H. N. Doscher, and Jas. C. Jay. E. C. Williams of Newark, N. J., is ventilated by E. E. Lambert, while the Williams Stamp Co. also of Newark, N. J. is pointed out by Harte.

We have become wearied of writing the names of H. J. Collerd and G. W. Keifer. They have apparently swindled nearly every dealer in the United States.

Dealers be careful in sending fraud lists not to accuse innocent parties. First find out that your man is a fraud. Then expose him.

In a recent letter M. Steffan says: "I think 'twas due largely to my efforts that the Prince of Present Frauds was arrested in Chicago while going under numerous names. I refer to the Union Stamp Co. of 2241 N. Ashland Ave., Chicago." Score one for Steffan.

Dealers have various ways of introducing the gentlemen (?) who have swindled them. M. Steffan says: "Find herein my list of frauds. Will furnish particulars in any case." Earl Bros. rise to remark: "We enclose a list of promising candidates for support by the various states in which they reside. We trust our loss will be some other fellow's gain." Their list is headed: "\$52 worth of Experience." T. J. Mitchell writes: "I have not seen the following gentlemen introduced to the Philatelic Public yet." The Housatonic Stamp Co. is responsible for: "We enclose list of those we have tried and found wanting." Quiet Henry S. Harte says: "I enclose you a list of my fraud friends." E. C. Biggar and E. J. Thompson briefly remark: "Insert the following frauds." Jay of "local" fame greets us with: "Enclosed find list of frauds. I know them to be frauds." Lambert simply ejaculates: "Frauds," and jots down the names.

On Jan. 16, '91 we notified him to make returns but no answer came; on Feb. 24 we sent him last notice in registered letter for which we hold his receipt, but as nothing has as yet been heard. He is a dead beat. Please expose him."

A. B. Merrill says: "Geo. W. Pepper and H. L. Walker according to my experience are each worthy of space in your list, and I trust the next number of the "P. F. R." will give them all 'honor' deserved." They are published in this number.

All dealers should emulate the example set by S. S. Atwood. He notifies each delinquent five times before he publishes his name as a fraud.

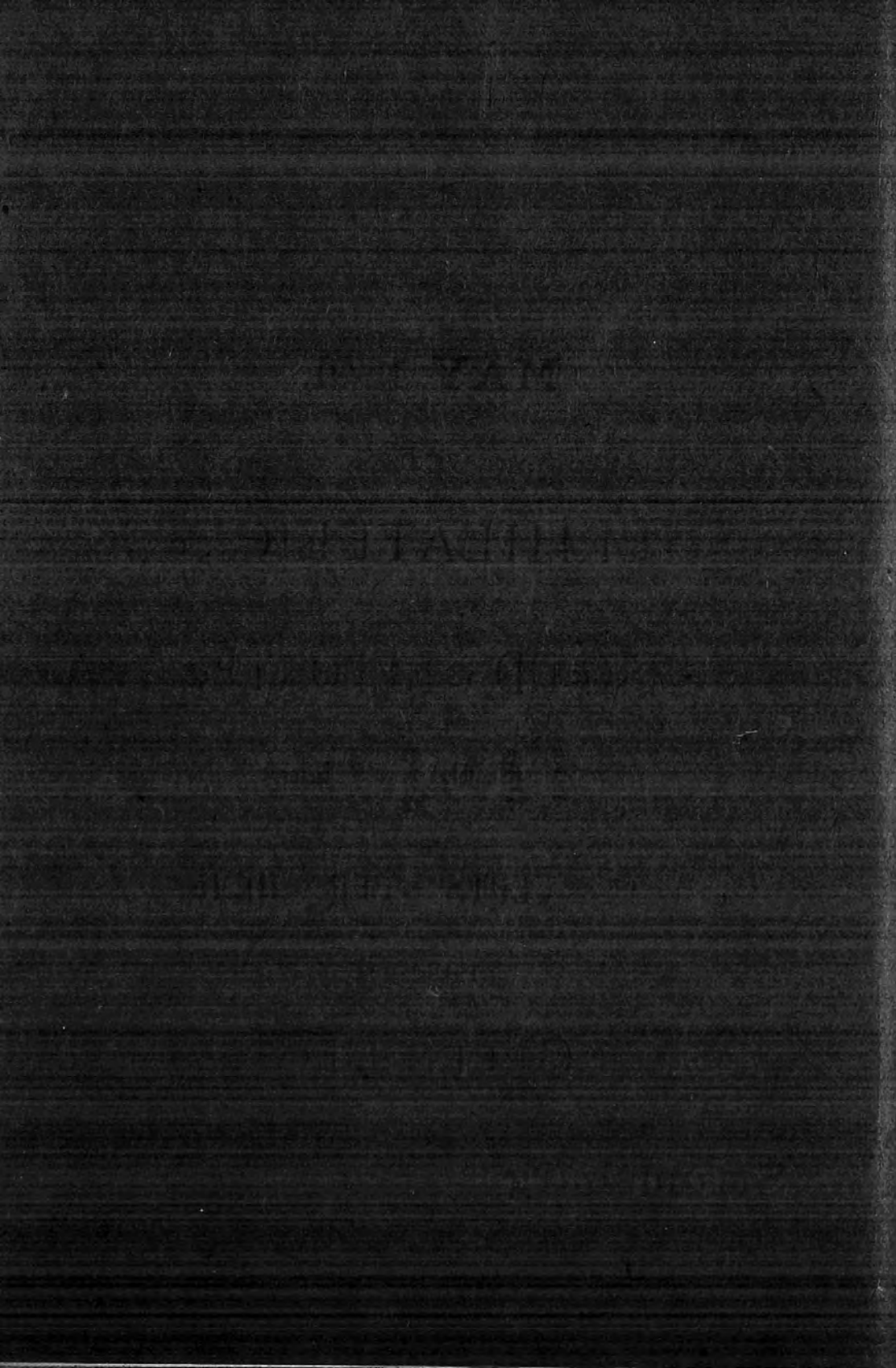

Dealers when sending fraud lists should make out the names in alphabetical order. It saves us much trouble.

EDITORIAL.

Wm. C. Rankin, of Lexington, Mass. sends us another Burmeister letter with a postscript somewhat different from those heretofore published by us.

W. H. Bruce sends us his sixteenth annual price list of United States stamps, sets, and packets. The prices are very reasonable.

It is with pleasure that we call your attention to the advertisement of the Standard Stamp Co. in this issue. When a conservative firm of advertisers like the Standard advertise in a paper it speaks well for that publication. Had you not better follow the example of the St. Louis firm.

We must caution dealers once again in regard to sending names of frauds. Be perfectly sure your man is a fraud, and notify him of your intention to publish him before you send in his name. We are constrained to make this statement on account of R. Asheroff's communication in this issue.

H. P. Boyle, of 1719 Q street, N. W. Washington, D. C. informs us that owing to a sudden change in his plans by which he goes to college he will be unable to issue the Philatelic Annual as he had anticipated. Mr. Boyle had already spent something like \$100 in the preparations for this work, and its failure to appear will be regretted by all philatelists.

M. Steffan has favored us with a letter from Geo. S. Evans, P. O. Inspector of Boston, which confirms the fact that C. H. Cooper is an unusually active fraud.

He has also swindled M. Steffan out of stamps by substituting. A LONG CHASE ENDED.

ALBERT B. QUIGLEY'S CLEVER METHOD OF DECEPTION.

After over three months of waiting and watching Lieutenant Hanson of the Fifteenth district had his vigilance rewarded yesterday by capturing Albert B. Quigley, alias A. Burmeister, a stamp dealer who is wanted by the Post Office Department on a charge of illegally using the United States mails for the purpose of defrauding. On October 2nd last Postal Inspector B.H. Camp, of Jersey City, placed in Lieutenant Hanson's hands a warrant issued by United States Commissioner Bell for the arrest of Quigley who at times makes his home with his father, Albert Quigley, at No. 1889 Oxford street, Frankford, but whose business address, under the name of A. Burmeister, is at No. 140 High street, Newark, N. J., and from which place it is alleged, the fraudulent use of the mails was conducted.

Quigley's plan was to send to stamp collectors a type-written letter "dictated" in which he sets forth that having given up the business of a collector of foreign stamps he had a list of 73 correspondents in all parts of the world which he had at great expense to himself by liberal advertising been able to gather together; that all his correspondence with these people was in English and that he would cheerfully give them the names but thought two dollars should be sent him for them.

Lieutenant Hanson, who had been on the lookout for Quigley since the warrant for his arrest had been placed in his hands, saw young Quigley enter his fath-

er's house yesterday, and at once detailed Officer Yonker in citizen's clothes to watch the premises and arrest him when he came out, which he did later in the day. When searched at the station house one type written letter was found on him, together with a great number of letters from foreign countries. Among them one from Samoa, Sandwich Islands, and one from British Columbia. Also a number of uncanceled foreign stamps, Suez Canal, Samoa Express, Germany and the Netherlands. Also a membership card, showing him to be a matriculated student of the University of Pennsylvania session of 1889-90.

AT LAST.

CHARGED WITH MISUSING THE MAILS.

Albert Burmeister, alias Albert Quigley, 22 years old, of Oxford street, Frankford, was locked up in the Frankford Police Station last evening, charged with using the United States mails for fraudulent purposes. Lieutenant Hanson stated that he had been arrested on a warrant sworn out, on October 2nd, by Post-office Inspector Camp, and will be turned over to United States Commissioner Bell this morning.—Philadelphia Ledger, Jan. 12, 1892.

tion. I enclose his letter, the first and only one he has written me. As it was the first reply, I accepted it, and sent the package by W. F. Ex. Co. (The American not touching here; but the W. F. Transfer their Racine freight to the American) It was sent C. O. D., \$10.25. On or about Jan. 13th, I received the enclosed from the W. F. Co., together with notice from Racine office, stating that "the package was refused, claims to know nothing about it; no invoice with goods." Now this Mayer of course must have known what that package contained, as it was marked "From P. A. Lovewell, 1691 College Ave., Topeka, Kans." As he (Mayer) sent no references and was obliged to send C.O.D., besides, I understand he has the privilege to examine goods at office. Well, I immediately wrote to W. F. Ex. Co., and said that if I didn't get reply to letter sent that day to Mayer, before the 25th, I would give them directions for disposition of package. I wrote, as I said, to Mayer, both a card and a letter, but got no reply, so ordered the package shipped to another applicant whom I am sure is reliable (R. P. Spooner,) and wrote to Mayer another card, telling him I should expose him if he did not explain himself, but have not heard a word from him.

This has cost me quite a little sun (as much as many dealers report "sheet thieves" for stealing,) so I would like your opinion as to what course to pursue, It looks a little as though he wished to get a chance to "scoop" the goods if sent not C. O. D.



I also notice that a new firm, the DuQuesne Stamp Co., has started up and I have heard from a friend in Pittsburg that he is almost sure that the firm is the same. If this is so, I suppose they have started up as this firm for disposing of their ill-gotten gains. I wrote several times to the Penn Stamp Co. and to Gus. C. Lubitz, and all letters of late have been disregarded. Have placed the matter in the hands of an attorney some time ago.

A CLEVER FRAUD.

To the Editor of the Fraud Reporter.

Dear Sir:—I would bring to your notice

the name of a fraud who has been doing a flourishing business through lock box 28 of the Camden Post Office, Camden, N. J. He is as nice a swindler, as one would do business with. He writes as follows:

"Gentlemen:—Please send me a number of your best approval sheets and if they are satisfactory will be able to dispose of a large quantity." We send him the sheets of stamps as requested, and a few days later he writes to us and says that he has sold half of the stamps from our sheets and we must send him more, and he will remit as soon as he makes his next returns. After he has kept the stamps for about four weeks, and after we have written him politely a number of times, we not even got an answer and we see at once how cleverly he had defrauded us.

The next thing we do is to write to the General Postmaster at Camden and tell him about this fraud and a few days after we receive the following reply:

"To the Schiff & Machado Stamp Co.,
224 Greene St., N. Y. C.

Gentlemen:—In response to your inquiry of the 23rd inst. in reference to one J. J. Morgan, who rented box 28 at this office, I will state that he is a fraud and that you are but one of a vast number of dealers in this country and Canada who have been victimized by him. We placed the matter into the hands of W. P. Edgerton, Post Office Inspector of this district, located at room 12, 2nd floor, Philadelphia P. O., about a month ago, and since that time efforts have been made to apprehend the said Morgan but up to date without success. Your letter will be placed in the hands of the Inspector along with numerous others of a similar import and I have no doubt you will be duly informed by him of any further development in the case.

All dealers who have been defrauded by the above named person should send me full particulars about the case as we must make an example of this fraud and send him to prison where he belongs. I would advise all collectors from purchasing from him as he sends out a circular advertising his bargains.

We would advise all dealers to be careful in dealing with Horace Stone, of 2461 Kensington St., Phila., Pa. He is another example of a fraud who should be in prison the rest of his life. He writes as follows: "Gentlemen:—Please send me a few of your stamps, and if they are of the right kind will buy some." A few days after we receive a postal card from him in which he writes us to the effect that our sheets are generally fine and he expects to be in New York shortly. We send him a small wholesale selection, and about four weeks after we write to him to return the stamps as we only allowed him 14 days to look at the stamps. After that they must be returned. We wrote him four times to return the stamps but never received an answer, and we placed the matter in the hands of the Phila. P. O. and received the following reply:

"Schiff & Machado Stamp Co.

Gentlemen:—Your letter to hand and in reply will say that we have placed your letter into the hands of the Inspector at this P. O. and we hope to find the fraud before long.

We have a faint suspicion that Horace Stone of Phila., Pa., and J. Morgan of Camden, N. J. are one and same people, as the two cities are opposite one another, also the letters are written something similar, and it would be beneficial for any dealer to look out for these two sharpers, and if they should write to any dealer re-

questing stamps we would be thankful to have their address from where they wrote their letter, as they may be working some other part of the country by this time.



LITTLE FALLS, N. Y., June 7, '92.—Mr. Guy W. Green; Dear Sir: That the "P.F. R." is doing a great and good work in its line must surely be conceded by all; yet it is hardly complete, it seems to me, unless you slow up every sort of fraud in the stamp line. Without caring particularly about giving names, may I ask that you give space to calling attention to the fact that there are unscrupulous dealers (so called) who, in the guise of carrying on "auction sales," solicit consignments of duplicates or sets from collectors with the view of capturing the prize, if any for themselves at a small outlay. My personal experience has been—since I have tried their plan and found it best to have a friend bid on my lots—that my friend's bid of 45c is "too low;" yet I am allowed but 8c on the same lot, 7c ad valorem, the stamps in said lot catalogue over 70c. The first sales netted me handsomely, but alas! I doubled the number of lots and he, doubled, yes quadrupled, the other way. Can you not simply call attention to this in way of warning. I hand you name of two parties for the fraud column.

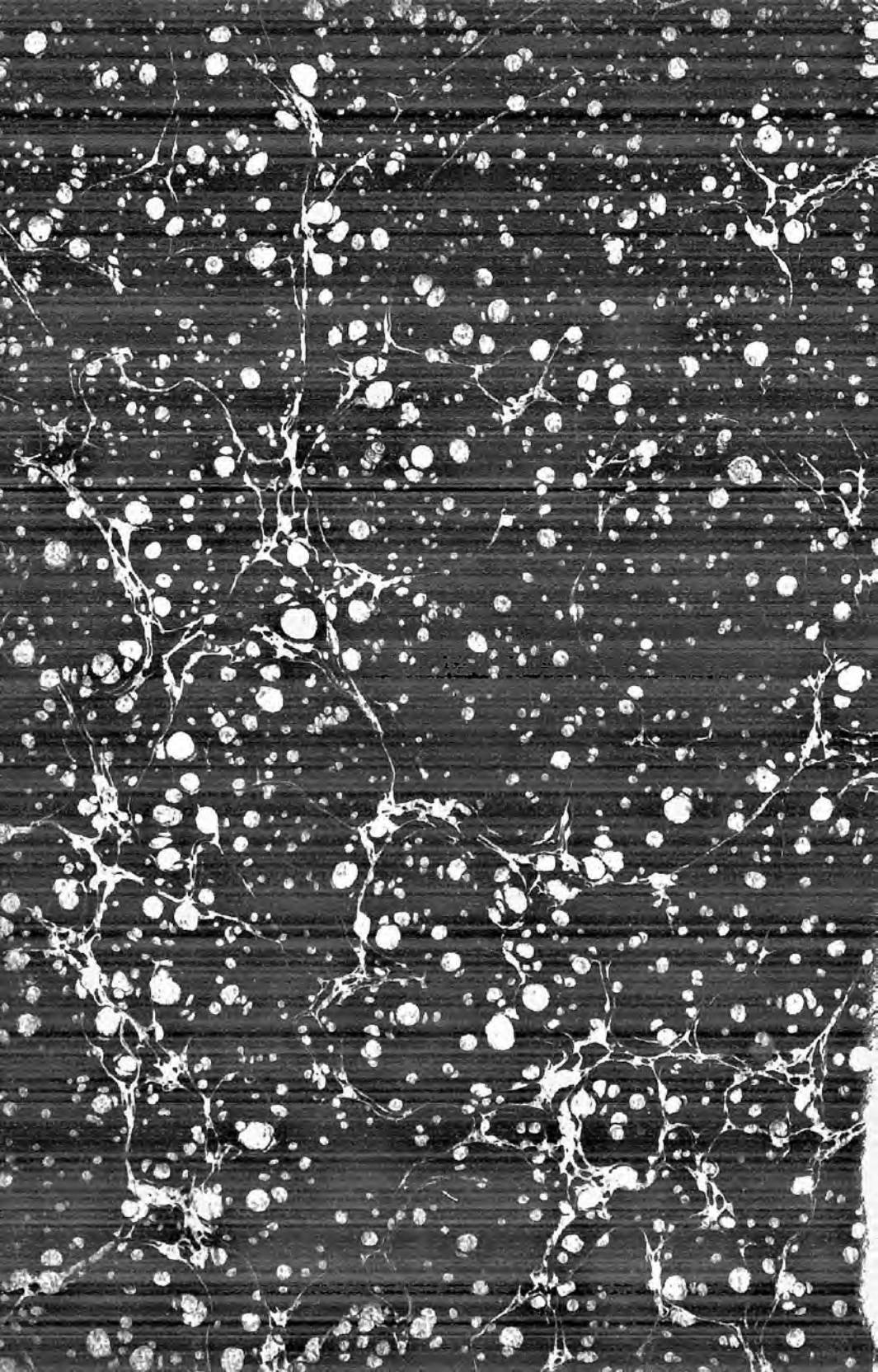
