NOTES OF THE MONTH.

"VOL. IX. No. 1." The figures which appear on our front page this month are significant. They tell but bluntly of years of hard work rewarded by steady yet persistent progress. The ADVERTISER passed this month into the ninth year of its existence. Started as a supplement to the *Philatelic Journal of Great Britain* it was retained by the founder when the magazine was sold, and the supplement was conducted as a separate concern. Since the severance the proprietorship in the ADVERTISER has changed hands twice, but it has never failed to meet with the cordial support of the stamp trade and of collectors generally.

* * *

The ninth year of the ADVERTISER will be marked by substantial improvements, and the present management, realising the value of the journal as an advertising medium, is keenly alive to the interests of its chief supporters, the advertisers, and its best endeavours are being put forward with a view to increasing the already large circulation. But the management is no less anxious to guard the interests of collectors and while it cannot accept responsibility in the matter of dealings between advertisers and clients, a careful control will always be exercised with a view to excluding undesirable notices or announcements from the publicity which this journal affords.

The ADVERTISER is, without question, the one British stamp journal which extends its useful influence to every civilised country in the world. In the publishing office of this journal is a glass case, containing a curious collection of original covers from all parts of the world. The auctioneers are having a good season just now in spite of the laments we heard a few months back of the difficulty in finding a sufficiency of lots to fill the lengthy catalogues. Prices seem to be ruling fairly high, and the out-of-London auctioneers get prices that a few seasons back were unheard of. Glasgow has periodical sales at which the attendances are good and even Brighton, which had its

first big auction a few weeks ago, remarkably good prices were secured.

* * *

We frequently hear the dealer-auctioneer criticised, but to our mind there are one or two points of some considerable weight usually overlooked by such critics. A dealer-auctioneer is usually a man who was first a dealer, then an auctioneer as well. He has attained in the former capacity an expert knowledge and philatelic skill which enable him to treat his clients on a far more satisfactory basis than the auctioneer who has not such experience and knowledge. Mr. W. Hadlow is a case in point. As a keen-eyed philatelist whose knowledge of stamps is exceeded by the very few, he is an auctioneer upon whom the provincial buyer can put every faith and whose advice to vendors must be invaluable.

* * *

Talking about auctions, there will probably be a goodly crowd of collectors and dealers at Messrs. Ventom, Bull & Cooper's sale on February 7th and 8th. The "star" attraction will be the sale by the instructions of the Crown Agents for the Colonies of the whole of the remainder of the British Guiana, 1890-91, 8c., lilac and green-black, in one lot.

* * *

There is no Exhibition in view to excite our enthusiasm this season, and the high tension created by the International Show of 1906, and the Juniors' Show of 1905, is scarcely to be expected to last long. There's plenty of life in the Junior Philatelic Society, however, and the Royal Society is already feeling the stimulus which everyone anticipated would result from the high favour which has been conferred upon it by the bestowal of the title "Royal." The latest bubble of enthusiasm on the part of the Juniors, is the gigantic effort they are going to make to provide a philatelic drama for London playgoers. The little comedy or tragedy (the line between the two is so finely drawn that either name will serve) which was played last year at the Bijou Theatre, is to be revived at the Cripplegate Theatre, which is much more centrally situated and will doubtless meet the convenience of all members, non-members and friends, being close to three Tubes and four Railway Stations. The date is April 6th, and the sofa stalls are only 2/6, so it will be cheaper and more enlightening to take the good lady or the girl to the philatelic play than to the average, commonplace, unphilatelic and consequently unenticing West End productions!

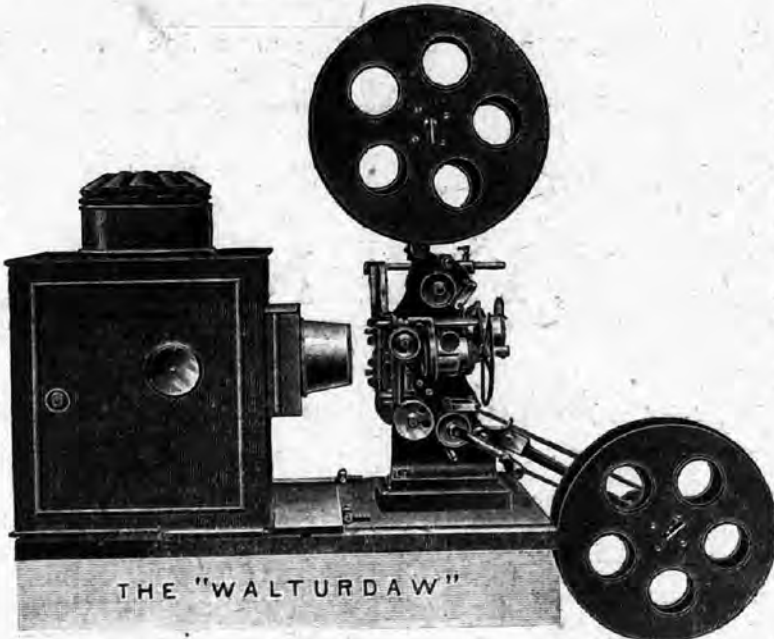

NOTES OF THE MONTH.

A Philatelic Libel Action.

THE important libel action, *Lowden v. Ewen's Colonial Stamp Market*, was heard on February 9th, before the Lord Chief Justice and Special Jury. With the defendants were joined Pardy & Son (printers) and W. R. Russell & Co., Ltd., as publishers. The case, which lasted five days, was of intense interest to the philatelic world. A noticeable feature was the array of Counsel, including Mr. Gill, k.c., Mr. Gerald Hohler, k.c., and Mr. W. S. Knight for the plaintiff, and Mr. Clavell Salter, k.c., and Mr. Compton Smith for defendants. Most of the well-known dealers and philatelists were present, either as witnesses or spectators, amongst whom we noticed Messrs. E. W. Brown, C. J. Phillips, Yardley, Oliver (Bright & Son), J. H. and J. S. Telfer, C. Nissen, Percy Bishop, Charlick, P. L. Pemberton, O. Marsh, Harry Roberts (Durban), H. Z. Kuttner, and others. An interesting exhibit was the Official Album of the Crown Agents.

Mr. Gill, k.c., in his opening speech, said the action for libel was based on statements published in "Ewen's Weekly Stamp News" that certain surcharged stamps sold by plaintiff were forgeries, and suggested to the jury that the defendant's statements were actuated by trade jealousy, with the intention of ruining the plaintiff's business. The defendant was a rival dealer, and finding that plaintiff had obtained a monopoly of the stamps in question (C.S.A.R.), which he (Ewen) was unable to obtain, had determined to destroy plaintiff's business by declaring them forgeries. Defendants on being pressed for an apology had stated through their solicitors, that the statements complained of were justifiable and fair comment, and further had stated that owing to the amount of unfavourable correspondence received, had decided to risk an action for libel. One of the principal witnesses for plaintiff was Mr. Harry Dresch, a copyist in the Crown Agents' Office, who deposed as to having sold plaintiff a large quantity of Transvaal C.S.A.R. stamps as received on letters and placed in his office. This witness, however, in cross-examination, whilst naming values composing the set, made four mistakes and stated the colour of the 5/- denominations, which he had also sold, to be yellow. For the defence, Mr. Oswald Marsh was called to speak as to certain stamps seen by him in plaintiff's shop, and also as to certain information given him by plaintiff, to the effect that there was a second printing of the C.S.A.R. stamps and as to numbers issued. In cross-examining Mr. Marsh, Mr. Gill put that he understood witness to suggest

that if a dishonest dealer had not got a used stamp of a certain variety in stock, he could step behind a screen and postmark it from a pad! As expert, Mr. E. D. Bacon was called, and unhesitatingly pronounced the surcharges to be forged. The plaintiff had stated that the second type C.S.A.R. were printed in blocks of fifteen. This, said Mr. Bacon, was impossible. Representatives of Messrs. De La Rue (speaking of Somaliland surcharges) and Messrs. Stephenson, Blake & Co. (type-founders), as to C.S.A.R. surcharges were to be called as experts as to type used. In the summing up, which lasted two hours, Lord Alverstone, who went over each point with great clearness and detail, put the facts and issues before the jury. After an absence of forty minutes the jury returned a verdict for defendants, stating that the articles complained of were fair comment, and that both postmarks and surcharges were forged.

Deaths in Philately.

It is with very great regret that we learn of the death of Mr. L. Savournin, the well-known specialist in British Stamps and Secretary of the Junior Philatelic Society. A long and interesting article by Mr. Savournin, on the College Stamps of Great Britain, appears in the 1907 edition of the "Stamp Collectors' Annual."

"Gibbons' Stamp Weekly" announces the death of Mr. William Thorne an American collector well-known on both sides of the Atlantic. The death is also announced of Mr. R. R. Bogert, one of the oldest American stamp dealers. He died at Brooklyn, U.S., on the 23rd January, 1907, at the age of 64 years. He had been a stamp dealer for thirty years, and was greatly respected by dealers and collectors. He collaborated with Messrs. Tiffany and P. Techert in an elaborate work on U.S. envelopes.

Missing American Fiscals.

The newspapers report a great commotion at Albany, New York State, over the alleged disappearance from the State Offices, of five million dollars' worth of stock transfer tax stamps. Apparently the only explanation at present forthcoming is the statement made by an ex-clerk of the State Controller's Department, who declares that he burned stamps of the face value of about £480,000 sterling because they were badly printed.

Interesting Corner.

The Early History of the Post.

The Post was first organized in Europe by Charlemagne in 807.

* * *

The year 1635 is memorable as the date of the first establishment of a regular, though limited, system of internal postage.

* * *

In 1649, the Corporation of London started an Inland Post in opposition to that of Parliament, but it was soon afterwards suppressed by the Council of State.

* * *

In 1683, a Penny Post for London and its suburbs was first started by a Mr. Murray, an upholsterer, and ultimately handed over to a William Docwray.

* * *

In 1708, a Mr. Povey established a foot-post, called the "Halfpenny Carriage" for the conveyance of letters in London for a halfpenny. The authorities soon compelled him to desist.

* * *

Stage coaches were first used early in the seventeenth century.

* * *

It was an annual custom for the mail coaches to go in procession from Millbank to Lombard Street on the King's birthday.

* * *

The privilege of franking letters by Knight's, etc., began 1735.

* * *

In 1481, Edward the Fourth, then at war with Scotland, established a system of relays of horses from York to Edinburgh, the post stations being 20 miles apart, so that despatches were conveyed 200 miles in three days.

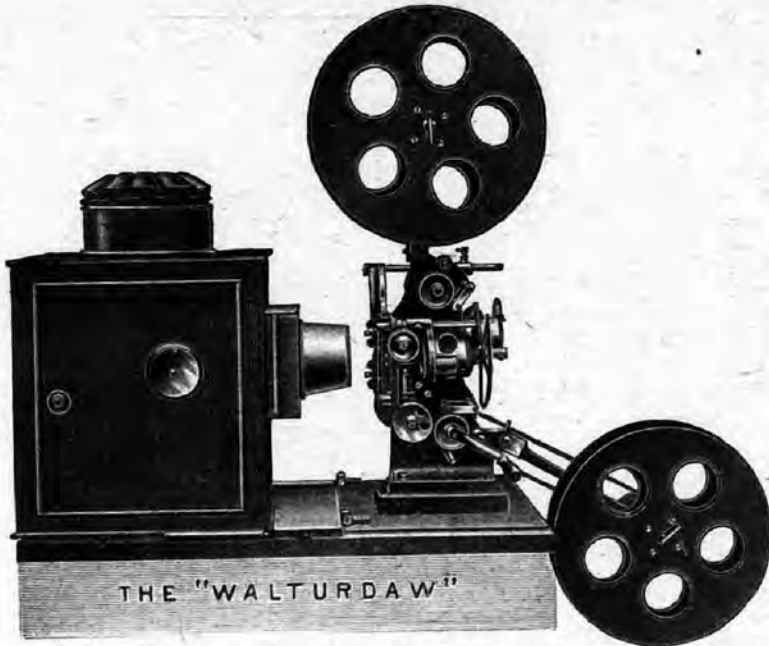

NOTES OF THE MONTH.

Trade and Auction Notes of the Month.

ONE has heard a vast deal about the splendid accumulation of stamps amassed by the late Mons. E. Le Roy d'Etioilles, and now being gradually dispersed, *via*. Hotel Drouet, under the able direction of Mons. Jules Bernichon. Splendid the stock certainly was in point of quantity, but as regards quality it must be frankly said that the various catalogues of this phenomenal series of sales have included a generous leaven of rubbish—or, at any rate, what we should regard as rubbish on this side of the Channel. It makes us rub our eyes, or as our vivacious friends in Paris would say, it "gives us furiously to think," when we see lots consisting solely of Moroccan Locals of the "Fez-Sefro" order commanding quite fat and healthy prices under the hammer.

Other Countries, Other Ways.

We have to remember, of course, that Frenchmen are keenly interested in Moroccan affairs, and it naturally follows that even the *soi disant* postage stamps of the various courier routes have a certain claim upon the esteem of the French philatelist. But, when all is said and done, how it must have tickled the ingenious German clerk who was proved to have manufactured the "stamps" of a certain mythical Moroccan courier post for his own private and particular gain, to note that a parcel of these precious labels had been knocked down at the Hotel Drouot for quite a respectable price! These are things that belong to the humour of the hobby. I say nothing regarding the staggering prices realised for various lots of French Colonials, for they are prices that stagger only those philatelists who are not French. Naturally the French collector collects the issues of the Republic's colonies and dependencies with quite the same avidity that we display in the hunt for varieties of British Colonials. *Chacun à son gout?* How else would you have it?

It is just this variation of philatelic tastes according to nationality that, in my humble opinion, constitutes the chiefest charm of the profession of stamp dealing. The wares of the ordinary huckster are not subject to great territorial fluctuations, so to speak. A pound of butter, practically, is worth about the price in London as it is in Nijni Novgorod. Not so stamps. Here, in England, the demand is all for British and British Colonials, with, perhaps, the United States and a few of the better foreign countries as a side line. Abroad what do you find? In France it is French and French Colonies; in Germany the old German States and the issues of the German Empire; in Italy the stamps of Sardinia, Naples, Sicily and the "Duckies"; in Spain the Spanish

Empire that-used-to-be, and so on *ad infinitum*. It is the inevitable result of the thing we call patriotism; and thus it happens that the best market for French Colonials is France, the best for German stamps is Germany, and most certainly the best for U.S.A.'s is the United States for America, and it may often happen (as I think the Bernichon sales have proved) that a bit of gummed paper which is despised in one country may be readily saleable in another. The fact is one that places a great opportunity within the reach of the shrewd dealer who desires to turn his foreign connection to the greatest possible advantage.

The "Stamp Collectors' Annual."

The "Annual" for 1907 is now on sale everywhere, and has been received with much favour. The contents include paper on the Board of Trade official stamps by I. J. Bernstein and on the College Stamps of Oxford and Cambridge by the late Lucien Savournin, as well as a useful Reference List and Guide to Values of British "Cut out" varieties, compiled by Charles Nissen. The Philatelic Library Index for 1906, compiled by the Editor, is a useful alphabetical guide to the worlds leading philatelic journals.

Another Philatelic Action.

Since the publication of the last ADVERTISER the legal action, *Ewen v. The Federal Stamp Company*, has engaged the attention of Justice Phillimore, the verdict being one of 40s. damages against the defendant Company. In the course of the case there was, unfortunately, an attempt made by persons associated with the plaintiff's case to identify Mr. Charles Nissen with the interests of the defendant, Mr. J. C. Long, the suggestion being that Mr. Nissen, for purposes of his own, had assisted and encouraged Mr. Long in his defence of the action. Nothing could be farther from the truth, and Mr. Nissen wishes to repudiate the suggestion in the most emphatic manner.

Some Forthcoming Auctions.

The auction season continues its steady and satisfactory progress towards the end of the season, prices being good and attendances at the sales fully up to the average. Messrs. Puttick & Simpson have some fine colonial and foreign lots in their forthcoming sales, as have Messrs. Ventom Bull & Cooper, Messrs. Glendining, and Mr. Hadlow. On April 11th and 12th Messrs. Plumridge & Co. dispose of the first portion of the choice collection formed by the late M. H. G. Cox, the second moiety being put up on May 9th and 10th. The catalogues for these two sales will be found to abound in rare and interesting items. Catalogues will be ready a month before the sale.

Interesting Corner.

The Scottish Penny Post.

In the year 1766 a penny post was established by one Peter Williamson, a native of Aberdeen. He had been in captivity among Indians for many years, and after his return he settled down in Edinburgh as keeper of a coffee stall or shop, in the hall of the Parliament-house. Being frequently employed by the advocates and "writers" frequenting the Scottish forum to carry letters and messages to different parts of the city, and, as he had doubtless heard of the English penny posts, he began a regular post with hourly deliveries, and established agents at different parts of the city to collect letters. He employed four carriers, who appeared in uniform, to take the letters from the different agents, and then to deliver them as addressed. For both these purposes they were accustomed to ring a bell as they proceeded, in order to give due notice of their approach. The undertaking was so successful that other speculators were induced to set up rival establishments, which of course led to great confusion. The authorities saw the success of the undertaking, and, aware of its importance, they succeeded in prevailing upon Williamson to accept a pension for the goodwill of his venture, and then merged it into the general concern.

* * *

In 1799 an Act was passed authorising the Postmaster General to send bags of letters by any private ships, such letters being subjected to half the packet rates. This is the origin of the ship-letter system, under which, besides the postal communication by regular packets, letters were conveyed to every part of world visited by private ships.

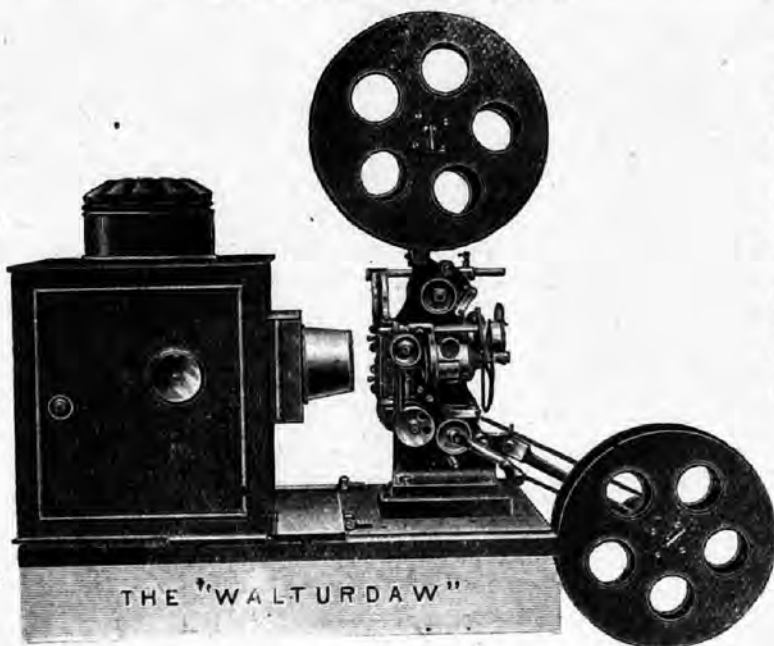

NOTES OF THE MONTH.

The Geographical Stamp Collection.

I HAVE been much struck with some passages in a letter recently to hand from a reader of the *International Stamp Advertiser* in California, U.S.A., and I shall take leave to quote his remarks as pointing to a very interesting, and I think little-practised, form of stamp collecting. "My own collection," says the writer of the letter, "is being built up on special lines. It now numbers between 40,000 and 50,000 specimens, and I may say that the ordinary run of stamps have but little interest for me, except in so far as the *places where they were used* are concerned. In other words, in the various colonies and other smaller countries I am gathering specimens that show the various cancellations and postmarks. For this purpose of course the cheapest stamps are quite as serviceable as the more expensive, the one essential point being that the cancellation or postmark in each case shall be clear and distinctly readable without actually making a 'nigger' of the stamp."

I can quite believe the writer of the letter when he adds that this line of work has proved a most interesting and fascinating study. The wonder to me is that the geographical type of collection, if one may so term it, is not in greater favour with philatelists. Possibly many readers of the *Advertiser* will be quick to perceive its possibilities and its obvious advantages, and in that event we shall hear more of "postmark specialism" in the near future. One of the most conspicuous advantages of this form of collecting is mentioned by the correspondent already quoted. "It certainly provides," he writes, "a ready distinction between stamps cancelled to order and those genuinely used for postal purposes." I have been surprised [he adds] to find what ignorance prevails as to the postal conditions in other lands. For example Hawaii had 88 post offices at the time of the annexation to the United States (74 of which are represented in my collection), whereas most people here would give the number as 30 to 40, with a possible 50. Bermuda has no less than fifteen post offices, Jamaica has about 185 (of which I have 142) and so it goes on." The form of collecting advocated by this gentleman is certainly calculated to provide a speedy cure for the species of ignorance of which he complains!

Philately still a Sound Investment.

People say that the palmy days of stamp collecting are gone, never to return. Rubbish! Philately is as good an investment now as

ever it was, judging by the results of the sale of the first portion of the H. G. Cox Collection at Messrs. Plumridge & Co.'s Auction of April 11th and 12th. In a packed room the bidding was of a most animated character, and the total realisation for the two days—in round figures £1500—includes many prices which go to show that money shrewdly invested in the right stamps inevitably brings a rich return. To quote one concrete instance, the late Mr. Cox sometime ago purchased from the publishers of the *Advertiser*, Messrs. Charles Nissen & Co., a small collection of curious postmarks, the price paid being £12. At the auction this lot, with the addition of about twenty specimens worth not more than £10, realised no less than £60. By the way the sale of the second portion of the Cox Collection is fixed for May 9th and 10th, at Messrs. Plumridge & Co.'s usual rendezvous, the Arbitration Room, at 63-64, Chancery Lane, W.C.

The Case of Lowden v. Ewen.

In view of this case being taken to the Appeal Court, an application has been made to the Appeal Judges, as reported in the daily newspapers of April 10th, to require the plaintiff in the original action to furnish guarantees for the costs of the appeal. The amount originally suggested was £50, but their Lordships finally decided upon £35 as the sum to be guaranteed by Mr. Lowden. Throughout the stamp trade rumours and reports as to further litigation have been rife, but it would be improper to say more now that the case is practically *sub judice* once again.

Cost of a Philatelic Action.

Mr. Ewen announces that the total costs incurred by himself in defending the action, *Lowden v. Ewen*, amounted to £912 12s. 3d.—"which," he adds, "seems rather a heavy penalty to pay for speaking and vindicating the truth."

A New Society for Fiscalists.

In America, where fiscal stamp collecting is a more popular section of the hobby than in our own country, a new organisation to be known as the United States Revenue Society, has been formed with an initial membership of a hundred. Mr. Geo. J. Carter, of New York City, is the President, and Mr. Holland A. Davis the Hon. Secretary of the new Society.

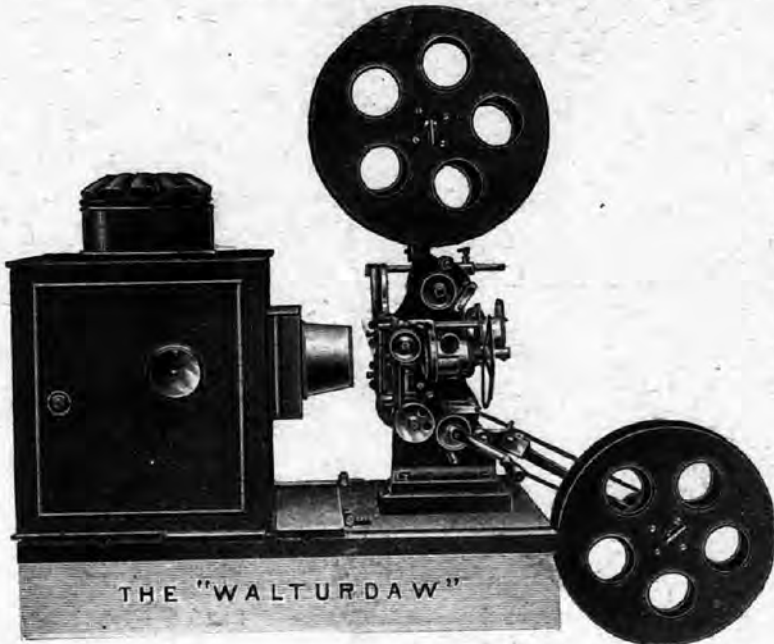

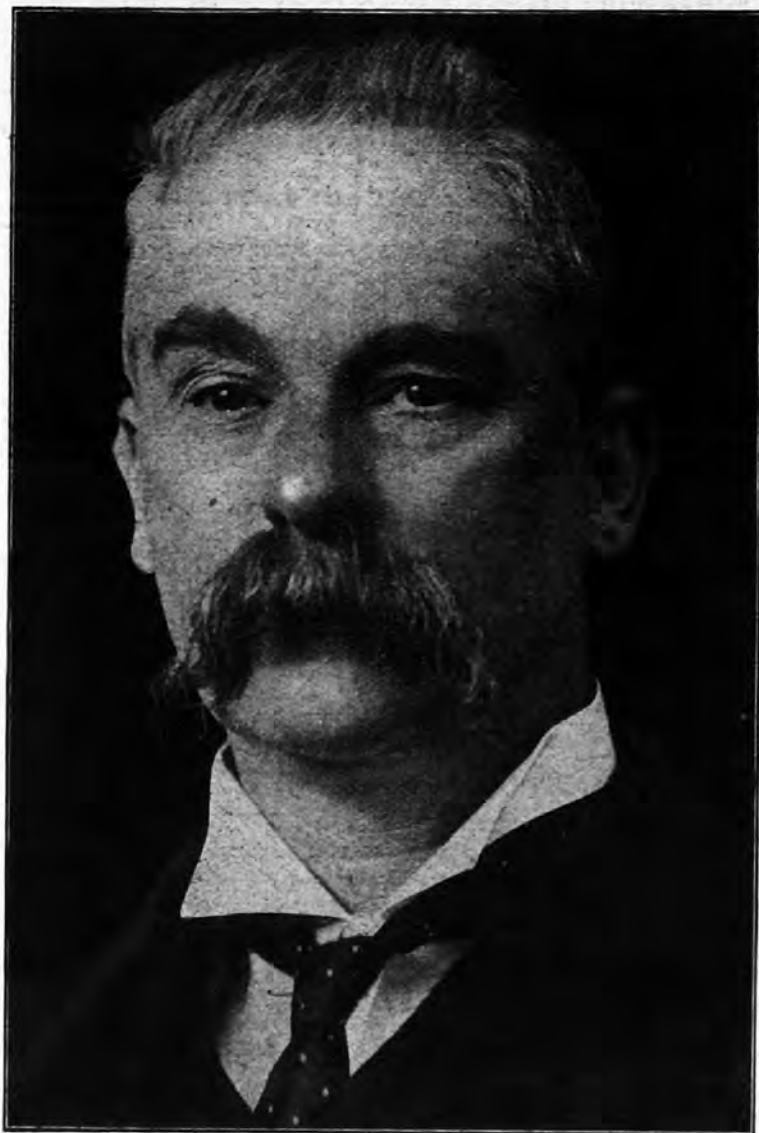

NOTES OF THE MONTH.

It will be a matter of general regret that the stamps of Modena, of 1859—the "Provisional Government" issue—have been reprinted. By some means, not stated, a gentleman in Milan has "acquired" the original steel plate from which the five values of the 1859 issue (5, 15, 20, 40 and 80c.) were printed, and has made "re-impressions" therefrom, and presumably in very large numbers, since he now offers them to the stamp trade in tens, hundreds, and thousands of sets. Fortunately the re-printer has provided us with a dual means of distinguishing between the originals and the "re-impressions." In the first place the paper is different, and, secondly, the inscription of value at the foot of the stamp shows a marked deviation from the original type. We are informed, in the circulars sent out from Milan that these differences have been purposely introduced in order that philatelists may not be led to purchase the reprints in the belief that they are the genuine original stamps. Unfortunately, however, a safeguard of this kind is not always an adequate protection if the goods so manufactured are retailed by unscrupulous agents. In the case of these Modonese stamps it was quite an easy matter to vary the type of the lower inscription, because this does not form part of the original steel plate. All the five values were produced from the one plate by employing movable types for the indications of value.

Most philatelists will decide to have nothing to do with these "re-impressions," since the 1859 stamps of Modena are still fairly cheap in unused condition, and it is as well to have the genuine article or none at all.

That the case of *Lowden v. Ewen* is not, after all, to be re-tried, must be a source of satisfaction to all who viewed the dispute impartially. No good purpose could possibly be served by going all over the same ground again, as would inevitably have happened. The trial in the Lord Chief Justice's Court, though interesting to some, was a weariness to others; and it was certainly not a good advertisement for Philately.

Most of our Philatelic Societies have reached or are approaching the end of their sessions. Looking backward over the past seven or eight months, one cannot fail to be impressed by the amount of useful propagandist and educative work performed at the various meetings of the London and Provincial Societies, which were never in a more virile condition than now. The marked increase in what we may call the "Associative" spirit among stamp collectors is, we are quite sure, largely due to the activity of the many junior societies which have lately come into existence. Hitherto the seniors have led and encouraged their younger confrères, but at the present time the position is almost reversed, for the junior bodies are undoubtedly making some of the oldsters look to their laurels.



REPRINTS OF THE 1859 ISSUE OF MODENA.

From the many exceedingly kind notices of the 'Stamp Collectors' Annual,' 1907 edition, which have appeared in the philatelic journals, it is apparent that the re-introduction of the "Index to the Philatelic Literature of the Year" is a particularly welcome feature of the publication. Historical Summary.

It was not to the reign of Charles I. that a Post Office for inland letters was established. In 1635 the King issued a proclamation in which he recites that up to that time there had been no certain communication between England and Scotland, "wherefore he now commands his Postmaster of England for foreign parts to settle a running post or two, to run night and day between Edinburgh and London, to go thither and come back again in six days, and to take with them all such letters as shall be directed to any post town in or near that road." It was at the same time ordered, that bye posts shall be connected with many places on the main line, to bring in and carry out the letters from and to Lincoln, Hull, and other towns. A similar post to Chester and Holyhead, and another to Exeter and Plymouth, were also to be established; and it was promised that as soon as possible the like conveyances should be organised for the Oxford and Bristol road, and also for that leading through Colchester for Norwich. The rates of postage were fixed at twopence the single letter for any distance under eighty miles; fourpence up to a hundred and forty miles; sixpence for any longer distance in England and eightpence to any place in Scotland. By a subsequent proclamation of 1637, it was ordered that no other messengers, nor foot posts, shall carry any letters but those alone which shall be employed by the King's Postmaster-General, unless to places to which the King's posts do not go, and with the exception of common known carriers, or messengers particularly sent on purpose, or persons carrying a letter for a friend.

1843 Maltese Cross OBLITERATIONS.



IN the year 1843 the above obliteration mark with a number in the centre was introduced for use in London City Post Offices, there were twelve different numbers, Nos. 1 to 12. No. 3 was without a cross at top. No official information is available as to what purpose these numbers were used, all the catalogues and books on postmarks we have seen always give the dates known from May 1843 to May 1844, we have had 1d. reds on the entire envelopes with this cancellation used in March 1843, and the earliest impression we have seen is No. 1 dated 21st March, 1843, on 1d. Mulready Letter Sheet.
