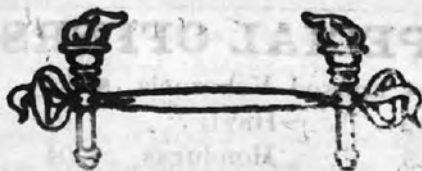

Never paste stamps down tight in your album. Use only the best peelable hinges which can be procured of any dealer at a few cents per thousand.

Terms of various printing are, 1st. Engraving, a print from engraved plates; 2nd. Typographed, a print from electrotype or stereotype plates; 3rd. Litographed, a print from stone; 4th. Embossing, a print or impression in relief or raised above the surface of the paper.

Famous scenes are pictured on the issues of the United States, Canada, New Zealand, Guatemala etc. Egypt shows her far-renowned pyramids. Animals are found on North Borneo, Labuan, Peru, Newfoundland, New South Wales, Liberia, Congo and others. Attractive scenery is shown on a set of Hawaii, Jamaica, Bosnia and Tasmania.

Britain shows her vast domains by the *Caledonia* map stamp. Maps are also on Newfoundland, Reunion, Venezuela, Panama and Colombia.

So by studying a stamp you may find out many things about the country issuing it.

NOVEL USE FOR POST CARDS.

Souvenir post-cards—that time-saving device invented by a genius—will in all probability enter into a meat boycott in Oklahoma City. Members of the Central Traders Union declare that the price of meat is unreasonable, and that the meat trust is securing a profit of greater proportion than that of other food-stuffs, on their goods. To extend and discourage the boycott, the post-card will be brought into play.

Ingeniously designed cards illustrating particular features of the boycott will be placed on sale about town. Many of these will be in the nature of cartoons seen in the daily newspapers, depicting the meat trust and seeking to extend the scope of the boycott. O.C.T.

Philatelic Notes.

The Philatelic Society of Sweden has issued a warning against current imperforate 5 o & 20 o stamps of that country which are now being offered. The statement is made that they are printer's waste and that the postoffice will not accept them for postage.

The change from blue to orange in the special delivery in 1893 was caused by the similarity of the blue special to the 1c Columbian.

It is announced that the British Government will get out its King George coins before it turns its attention to a new issue of postage stamps.

What is claimed to be the smallest post office in the United States is located at Moosa, San Diego Co. California. It is 33X47 inches, is served by the Escondido and Valley Centre stage three times weekly. Mr. Ike Frazee is Post Master.

The postmaster general of Germany is experimenting at Munich with the stampless letter post. The postoffice accepts cash for every letter handed in instead of a stamp attache to a letter by mucilage. The receipt and authority for mailing is represented by a machine stamping automatically the envelopes in different inks to designate the amount of postage paid.

Old Stamps Bring \$22,000

When Hanover was incorporated in the Kingdom of Prussia the stocks of stamps in the safes of its post-office were destroyed. However, a few sheets got interleaved with certain records and lay concealed and unsuspected for nearly half a century. Brought to light on the occasion of moving, they have been put up to auction in Berlin and brought a total of over \$22,000.

The senate post-office committee have added to the post-office appropriation bill a provision for a tax on the popular magazines. These periodicals say "It was an un-American, str-chamber proceeding, accomplished under presidential and political coercion" and "If the bill is passed many of the popular periodicals will be put out of business altogether, and the others, without exception, will be seriously crippled.

Philatelic Notes

The British postal authorities have decided to issue certain low value postage stamps in rolls for use in stamp-affixing machines. Just what values are meant our informant does not state.

Panama Republic will shortly issue un gummed stamps in book form, differing from those of the United States in that several denominations will be incorporated in each book.

The new Canadian stamps will not be placed on sale till about next June, the time of the Royal Coronation.

Ex-President Cleveland was a devoted collector of postage stamps, possessing, at the time of his death a very fair collection.

'Apropos to the estimate appearing in the Pacific Stamp News far February that only a few more than a thousand standard varieties of postage stamps had been issued to date, I feel that the following table might well be inserted. It formerly appeared in "Le Journal des Philatelistes" some time during 1907. It shows the number of stamps issued during the periods intervening between 1840 and 1906. Differences in shades, water-marks and sizes of perforations are unregarded in this table; only distinct varieties are taken into consideration.

Rare Strips

BY VEDA

One of the interesting pieces which graced the John K. Tiffany collection was a strip of five used 1d Peru 1862. It is doubtful if any other similar strip exists.

A used strip of three of the 90c 1857, remarkably well centered, with a light red cancellation was one of the pieces offered recently at a New York auction.

In the Seybold collection there was an almost unique strip of five used 10c United States 1847 issue, but unfortunately several of the stamps were damaged.

The Spiegelberg collection contained an interesting strip of four of the 15c on 10c green showing the surcharge in four different positions, vertical up, vertical down, horizontal and inverted horizontally. It was originally in the Chas. H. Wilson collection and is a very rare strip.

A strip of three 5r 1852 Spain on the original cover, together with a single specimen of the rare 2r was recently offered in New York. The postmark was Sautauder August 9, 1852 and the letter addressed to Havana, Cuba. Catalogue value \$64.50.

In the collection of F. Spregelberg of New York is a horizontal strip of three of the 20c unpaid which shows all three of the type varieties. As type II oc-

curs only once in a sheet it will easily be seen that such a strip is hard to pick up.

By mistake a Cliche of Mozambique got placed in a plate of Cape Verde when a printing of the 40r blue of 1877 occurred and consequently it is an extremely rare error. The Reynolds collection contained a strip of three where the middle stamp was the error. It goes without saying that it is an extremely rare strip.

A strip worth a hundred dollars is now being offered in New York. It is France 1853 80c lake and the left hand stamp of the three is tete beche. It was originally in the Gilbert E. Jones collection.

\$50,000,000 FOR CARRYING MAILS

PORTLAND, Ore., Mar. 21.-

Uncle Sam will pay the railroads of the United States \$50,000,000 this year for carrying the mails—an advance of \$5,000,000 over any previous figure.

The new postal law, copies of which have been received by post-office officials in Portland, shows the appropriation for the inland transportation of mails by railroad lines to be \$5,092,200, of which about \$49,000,000 will be available July 1 of this year.

Wooden mail cars will have to go out of commission soon, however, unless what may be a joker in the new postal law kills the intent of the department. The law provides that after July 1 no wooden cars, except those approved by the postmaster general can be operated in trains where the majority of the cars are steele or of steele under frame or between the locomotive and the steele frame car.—L.A. Rec.

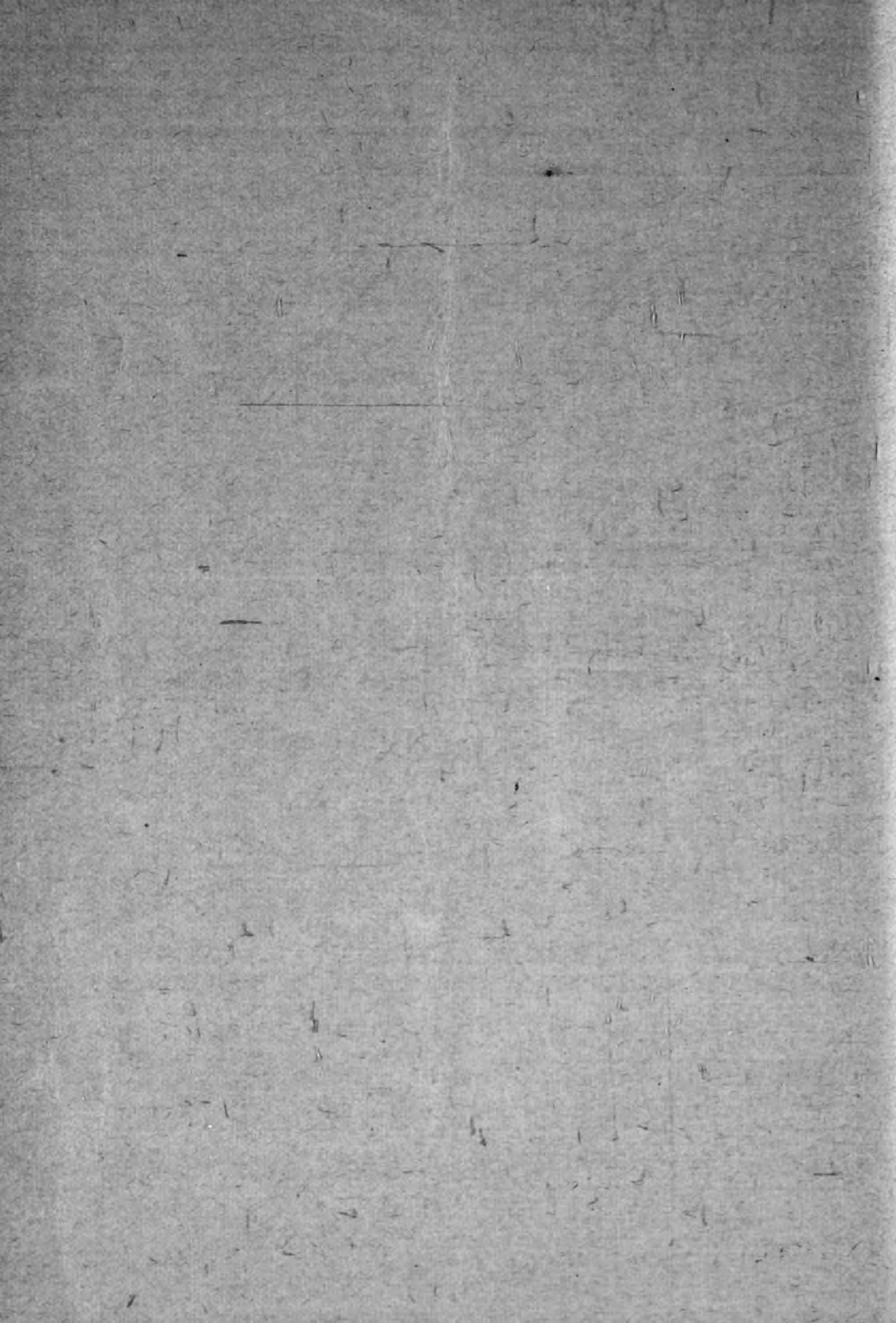

In Argentine, while most of the operation on the governmental telegraph is received by ear, yet the law requires that a tape record be used for reference and filing purposes. When the system was first constructed iron poles were used but now the native hardwoods, quebrache colorado, urdinday as well as some variety of palms are employed. In making a report a few years since U. S. Consul Ames stated that there were 13,600 miles with 515 offices in the government systems, while the railroads and others maintained 16,780 miles with 996 offices, which were under governmental supervision.

On December 11, 1902 a treaty was signed by representatives of the Argentine Republic and Bolivia authorizing the prolongation of the Argentine

system of railroads into Bolivia, one of the clauses calling for the free transportation of mails and mail clerks between the two countries. This was finally approved and adopted by Bolivia on August 13, 1903 by proclamation of President Pando.

The amount of revenue brought into the Mexican treasury through the medium of the use of fiscal stamps for the year ending June 30, 1895 was \$15,553,989.50 and the expense of collecting it \$1,233,119.74 or not quite eight per cent. In 1903 the amount of the receipts nearly doubled, being \$29,750,265.83 while the cost of collection was only about five and one half per cent.

From an old note book I notice that the sale of postage stamps by the Mexican post-

office for the months of August, September and October 1903 amounted to \$618,181.04, a gain of \$72,037.92 over the same months of 1902.

On October 25, 1904 a contract was made by the government of Nicaragua with Marcial Vanghan whereby the latter was granted the right to collect the revenue tax on tobacco for 200,000 pesos for the first year increasing 10,000 pesos each year succeeding for a period of ten years, of which the ninth clause read, "The government grants to the lessee and his employees the free use of the post-office, the government telegraph and telephone lines when employed with reference to business connected with collection of the revenue on tobacco. Has any one ever heard in what matter the franking privilege thus granted was used?"

Out of the finest things in South Americans which the first president of the American Philatelic Association, John K. Tiffany was a used strip of five of the Peru 1862 1d green. This strip was probably unique.

An uncatalogued stamp is Peru 1881 10c green with the oval Lima surcharge number 93, being similar to the 1c and 2c varieties listed as numbers 92 and 93.

A not over good specimen of the Bolivia 500c. 1871 brought well nigh unto catalogue price (\$35.00) at a recent New York Auction, \$29.00 buying it in.

A recent auction catalogue issued by J. C. Morganthau & Co. in listing Peru 1883 1c green and black, Scott's numbers 66 and 67 says, "These stamps are not recognized by the best authorities and are said to be reprints."

Some could be seen on the streets with silks, coats, jewelry and all sorts of trinkets which they wanted to sell. One of the soldiers had probably stolen the stamps and he sold them to the boy's uncle for a couple of dollars.

The sheet contained eighty stamps, each with the date of its issue printed above it.

When I came to look them over I was rather surprised to find that they were worth around ninety five dollars. Among them was the complete 1871 set, the one half sen brown (error) of the 1872 series worth seventeen dollars and fifty cents, The 1872 73 and 1874 were almost complete.

My friend thought Stamp Collecting a pretty good thing and is holding on to his Japanese Find.

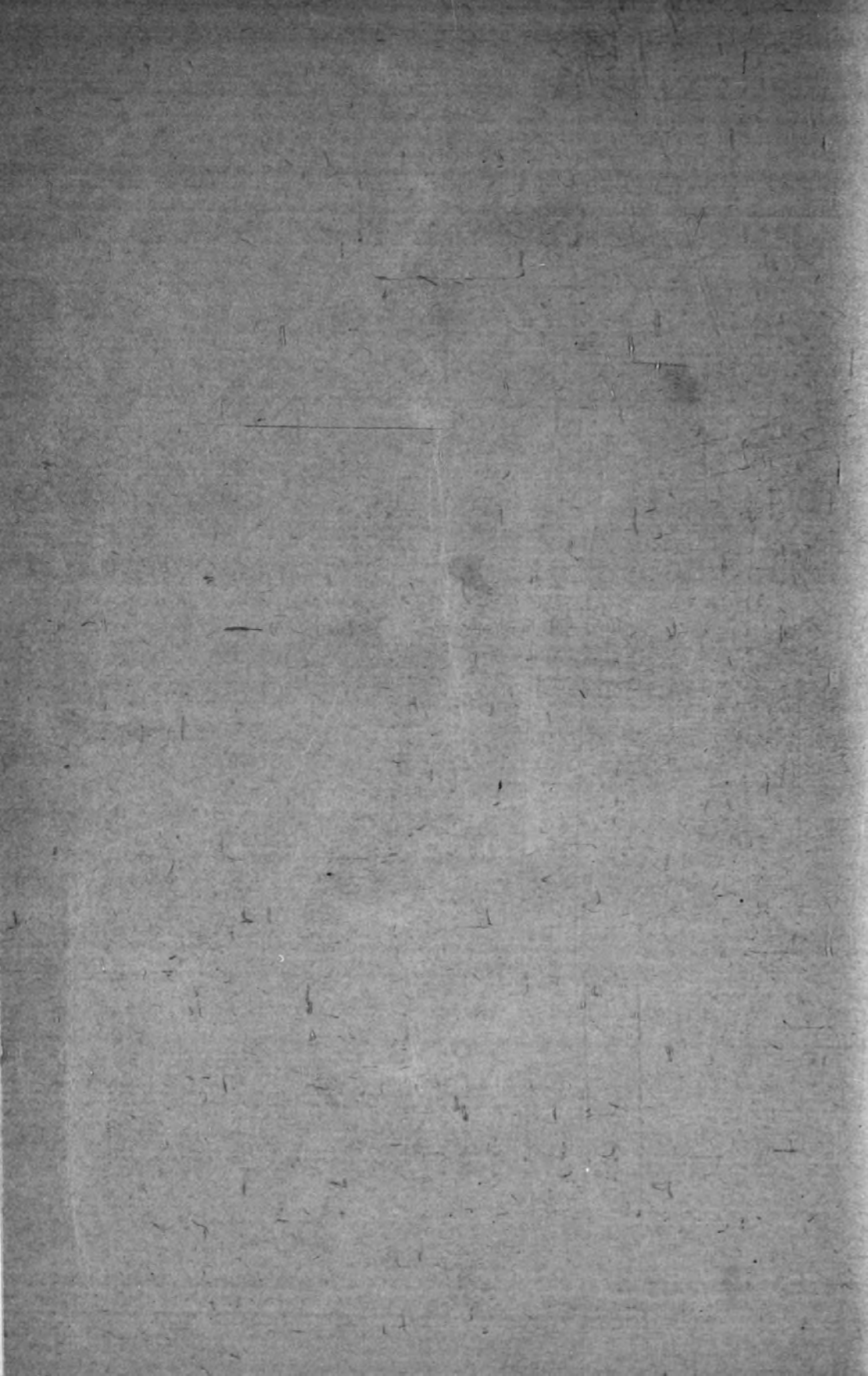

Another Amateur in the Field.

Way back in Kentucky, where publishers of stamp papers forget to date their letters and do the wonderful stunt of inserting advertisements without the advertisers' copy, or any order whatsoever to insert the advertisement, is located the city of Paris.

In this town resides a youth by the name of John Stuart, who, each month puts in the mail a 6x9½ circular which he calls the Precancel Monthly. This piece of printed matter contains notes on a few precancels and a few ads, for which the publisher charges 35c per year, or, he will be kind enough to send you a sample for four 1c stamps.

The latter part of March we received a letter from Johnnie with a copy of the March number of the Precancel Monthly containing a one inch advertisement pertaining to the Pacific Stamp News. He requested that we insert his one inch advertisement in exchange and on March 27th. We wrote him a letter stating we would do so, but as no copy was received from John by the 15th of April the May number went to press without it.

On receipt of the May number of our paper little John, not seeing his advertisement, almost had a fit, in fact we believe he did have one by the looks of the letter we received from him May 22d. NOW SHOWS SURPLUS

Postmaster General Refunds Money to Treasury

Washington.—For the first time in the history of the service it is said, the deficit in the post office department has been entirely wiped out and \$1,000,000 surplus for the current fiscal year ending June 30 is in the treasury to the department's credit.

Postmaster General Hitchcock has signed a warrant returning to the secretary of the treasury \$3,000,000, the last of the amount set apart from the public funds to assist in defraying the expenses of the postal service for the present year. Reforms in the financial system, it is said, have made the refund possible.
