Below done if you would SAVE MONEY. the bust are the words "One Cent" All kinds of job work executed in Just above these words on either the finest style and at the lowest side is a white figure 1. Color, possible prices. ultamarine blue.

Two Cents .- Profile bust George Washington. The surroundings of the bust are the same as in the one-cent stamp with the necessary changes in figures an l letters represening the denomina tion. Color, carmine.

Three Cents .- Profile bust of Andrew Jackson, Remainder of design same as in the one cent stamp, except figures and letters LAUREL GAP, * representing denomination. Color light brown.

Four Cents - Portrait of Abra h im Lincoln, Remainder of design same as above with necessary changes. Color, purple.


