Russia .- Our Moscow correspondent writing us under date 14/26 Octo ber, informs us that it is the inten tion of the Russian Government to issue two values of post cards, one of 3 kop, for local correspondence, and the other of I kop for general use throughout the empire Our friend also remarks that on the 1st o January a new 25 kop, postage stamp fo registered letters will make its debut.

Cape of Good Hope .- A five shilling stamp has been issued in this colony Colour-light orange. The size and de sign are identical with those of the lowe values.

France.-It is reported that two pos cards, of the values of 5 and 10 centime respectively, are about to be issued. Fo various reasons, however, we are incline to doubt this. We hear, however, upon good authority, that the rates of postag are to be raised 5 centimes. To meet thi the Government purpose issuing tw stamps value 15 centimes, brown, and 2 centimes, darkish blue. These will b used in place of the 10 and 20 centime stamps.


