Postal cards were first introduced by Prof. Herman of Vienna, October 1869. England adopted them in 1870, Norway, Prussia and the United States in 1872-3.

Since the first appearance of the black penny stamp of Great Britain, more than 6,000 varieties of postage stamps have been issued by nations, colonies and provinces.

The prepayment of letters by the use of postage was first advocated by Rowland Hill in 1837, and adopted by the English in 1840 on May 6.
