Reprinted from Bric-a-brac.

We have before us as we write, a sheet actually issued by the Government, of Reprints of South Australian stamps, even with the word "Reprint" stamped on their faces. Well, they are like the "Silver Bells and Cockles shells" in the nursery rhyme,—all of a row,—thirty stamps! varying in price from the half-penny specimen, to the Two shilling stamp. We do not pretend to fathom the intention of the Government in issuing these 'reprints', that is known only to the authorities; but, whatever reason they may have for issuing them; we have many better reasons, we believe, why they should not. It is not necessary to recapitulate here the arguments we have used over and over again. Reprints must be condemned: they are little better than forged stamps from our point of view. If the Government reproduce stamps, we may depend upon it that we shall not have long to wait before we see authorised reproductions reproduced in unauthorised quarters.
