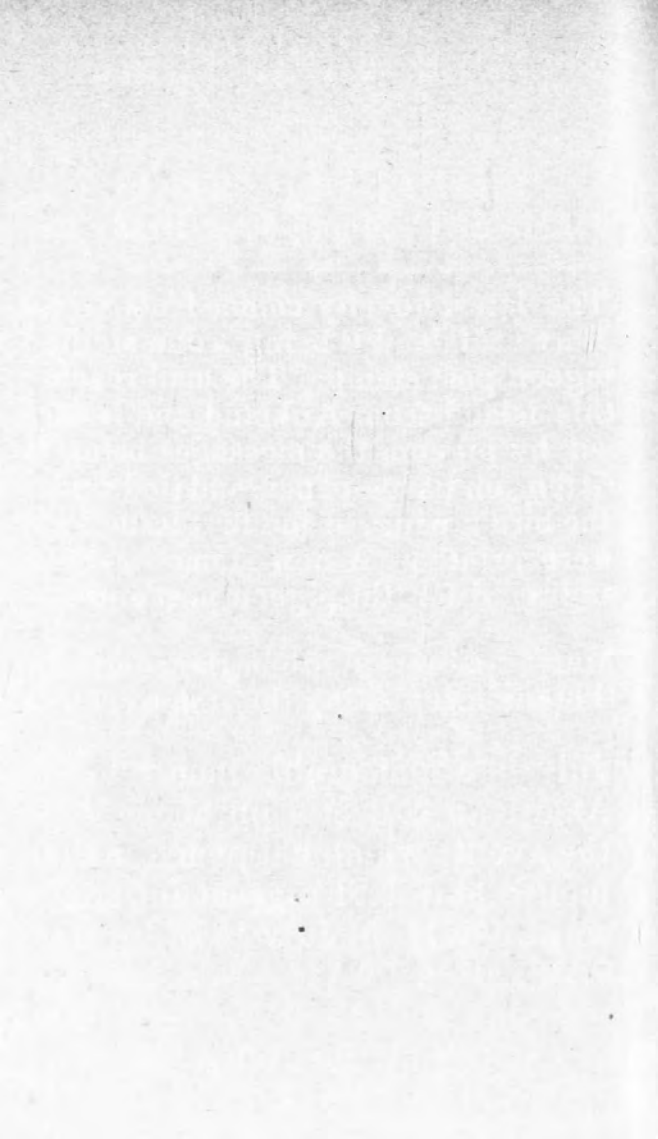

The latest novelty comes from Great Barrier Island it being a one shilling pigeon post stamp. The mail reaches this island from Auckland and is carried by pigeons the messages being written on tissue paper and tied under the bird's wing, of the first issue 1800 were printed. A new stamp has been engraved for the pigeon post's use.

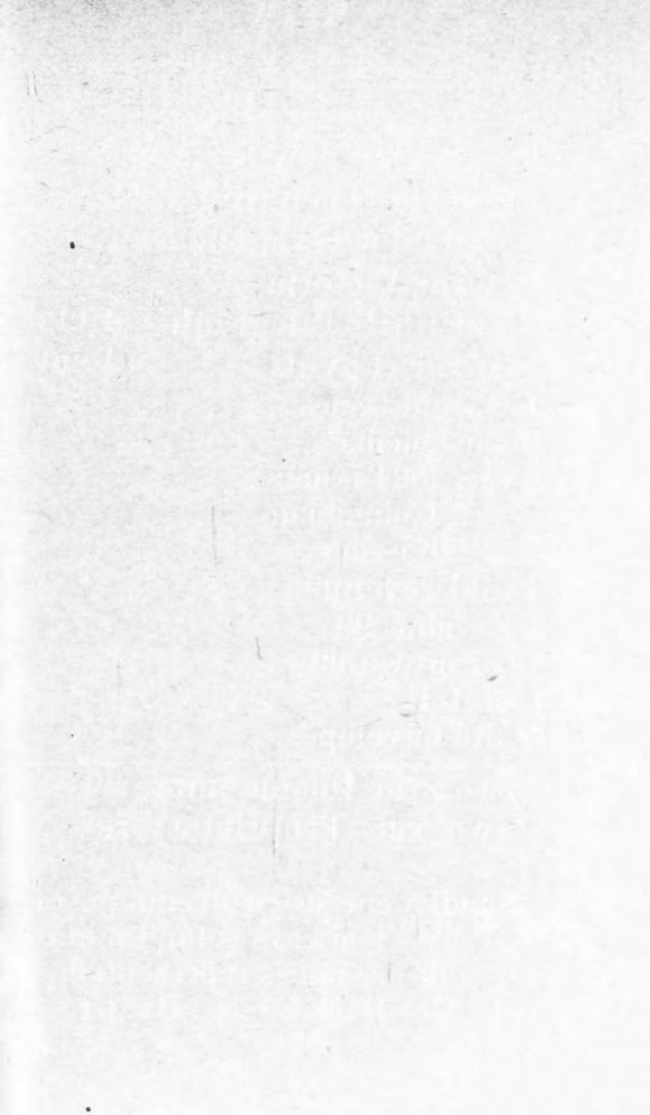

HELIGOLAND

Heligoland or as the natives call it Helligeland is an island in the North sea about 100 miles from Hamburg and is shaped like an L tuaned backwards. This is called the Rock island, the other called the Dune composed of sand was once joined to the rock island by a rock wall which the sea brok down and destroyed.

German is the official language but he country was owned by Great Britain up to nine years ago when Germany exchanged some African territory. The island is composeb of sand and soft stone and is being worn



away by the waves so rapidly that some time the country like the stamps will be obsolete. The first stamps were issued in 1867 and were printed in two colors as mentioned

1-2 sh., green & rose

1 " " rose & green

2 " " " "

6 " " green & rose

design : head of Queen Victoria in center with name in border at both sides and value at top and bottom. These were rouletted and the first two are quite rare being rated at \$20 each unused. The next issue was in 1871 and contained five new varieties as below listed

1-4 sh green & rose

1-4 " " rose & green

1-2 " " green & rose

3-4 " " " "

1 " " rose & green

1 1-2 green and rose

These stamps were all perforated and were of the same design as the first issue. The third issue was

in 1875 and had the value in both farthings and pfennige on each stamp there are two types of this set one having the head of the queen in an oval with value in figures at sides name in the curve above, second type the arms of Heligoland in center, value at sides same, curved above, of the first there were —

1 p	rose and green
2 p	green and rose
5 p	rose and green
10 p	green and rose
25 p	“ “ “ “
50 p	“ “ “ “

The second type with coat of arms had only two varieties 3 p green x rose and 20 p rose and green. The next issue in 1879 consisted of high values one mark green, rose and black 5 marks green, rose, yellow, and black

In 1875 the first envelopes were issued 10 p rose and twenty p on 10 d rose design: head of queen in oval & name above value at sides and bottom. In 1878 a set of wrappers were

issues 3 p green 5 p brown 10 p blue  
design coat of arms Heligoland above  
fancy scroll with value below.

Besides the straight issues there  
are minor varieties of many of the  
issues. They form a fine collection  
on account of their bright colors.  
The blocks from which these were  
printed were sold to a Hamburg  
dealer who reprinted them to sell  
to stamp collectors.

The first shipment of the cu-  
ban stamps of the special design  
has been made and dealers are ad-  
vertising them already.

Philadelphia is using a cancell-  
ing iron which stamps between  
the date oval and the stamp the  
words National Export Exposition  
and the date and place. Buffalo  
also uses ones to advertise the Pan  
American Exposition 1901.

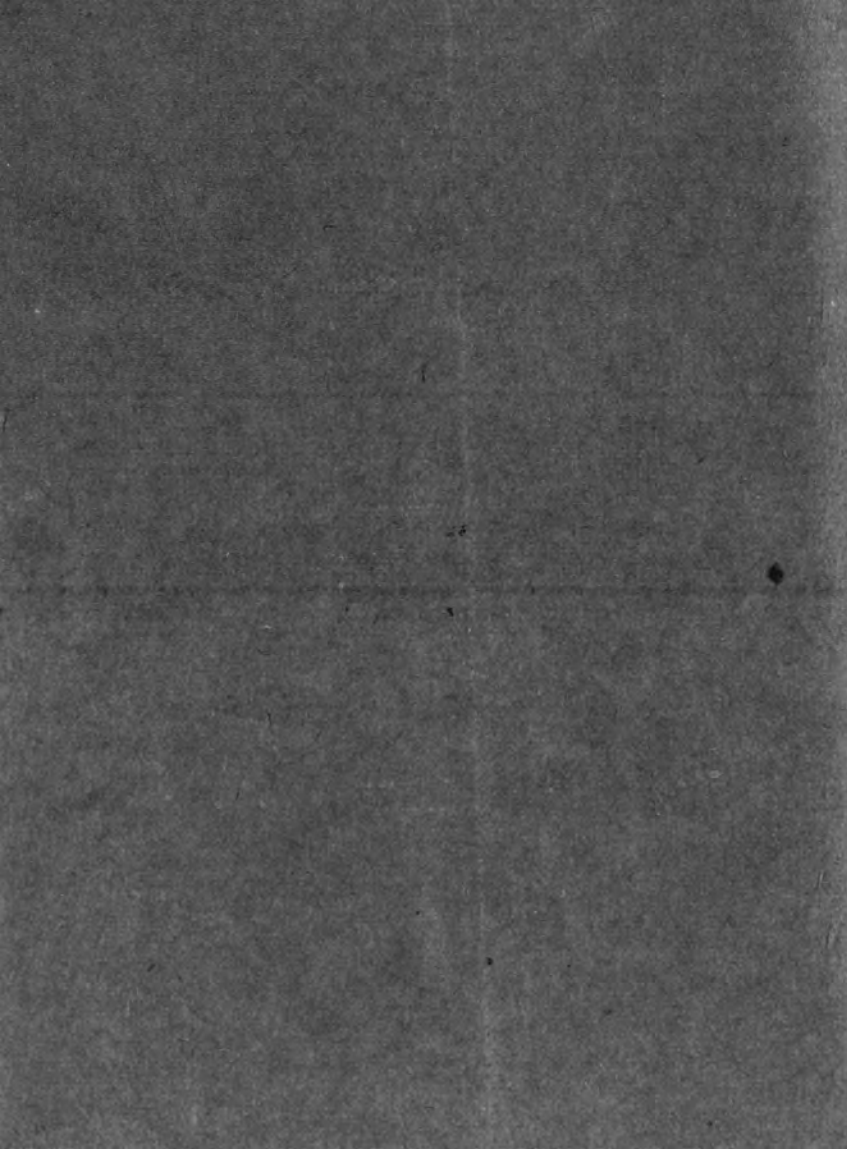

Happy New Year

NEW MONEY ORDER

The new money order much more resembles a check than an order the paper being about the size and shape of the express money orders, the advise instead of being written out as before copied with carbon on the white blank inserted between the orders, they are watermarked U. S. M. O. across the order.

It is reported that the Servian Government has disposed of the remaining stamps of the 1890 issue to a lawyer in Budapest a Mr. J Deszoe he will sell them at wholesale.

The Allegheny Philatelist has been chosen as official organ of the Iron City Philatelic Society of Pittsburg. This society was organized in February 1898 and has grown rapidly, monthly auction sales are held and a sales department for the use of the members.

The one penny red of Transvaal 1895 shows the old and new ways of travel in that land, in two views, one of a Dutch wagon on the move and one of a railroad train rushing from under an arch.

The present war in Africa is causing a boom in the stamps of the countries in the southern end of the continent, such as Natal, Orange Free State, Transvaal, Cape of Good Hope and other countries.

The Great Barrier Island stamps are causing much trouble now that it has been learned that the most of those sold in this country are forgeries put out by a Canadian dealer who has since left the country for Africa with the army.

It is stated that the collection of forgeries owned by Palmer, the London dealer, would be worth £1,000,000 if the stamps were genuine instead of forgeries, a room of his building is papered with 70 thousand of them.

A Canadian firm has issued an album B. N. A only, stamps, envelopes etc., price 60 cents.

Ordinary stamps are now in use in Porto Rico.

New Issues

**G**ermany: The present set of stamps has been in use since 1889 is now to be replaced by a new set bearing the bust of Germania which takes the place of the eagle, for the lower values and a set of designs for the high values.

**B**elgium the one franc has been changed to green, on account of the change of the 10c. to carmine the color with the 1 franc appeared in.

**G**UAM: the new lot of stamps for this land include the 10c. delivery and 50c. and \$1 values.

**M**exico: an entire new issue has been made consisting of 10 varieties of adhesives, 3 var. envelopes, 6 var. postal cards 4 var. letter cards. The 10 15 and 20c. have the arms printed in one color and the frame in another the 50c, 1 and 5 peso are larger and also printed in two colors.

**S**outh Australia; the 1-2 and 21-2 have appeared in postal union colors green and blue.

## STAMP DECORATING

Stamp decorating requires much patience, but many fine designs are made from common stamps. One way is by the stamp plate, made of a plate covered with various bright colored stamps after which it is coated with clear varnish, tied with ribbon and hung up on the wall.

Another way is by making large designs of many varieties. One of these, owned by an English gentleman forms a map of England and Wales composed of 2139 varieties of stamps, the counties are made up of different shades, the de-
