To tell you how to collect in a few words is by no means an easy matter. You may be dazzled by the cheapness of some packets; but the more dazzled you are the more cautious you need to be, especially until you have acquired sufficient knowledge to be able to detect forgeries. It stands to reason that if stamps are advertised at prices very much below the market value there must be something wrong:

either the vendor is ignorant — which is not often the case — or the stamps are worthless for some reason.

Sometimes the stamps are forgeries, sometimes they are reprints, sometimes remainders; but whatever the reason you may feel sure that as a rule cheap varieties should be avoided. Even if you see the stamps, your inexperience may mislead you; and I am afraid I cannot point out any royal road to philatelic lore. You must acquire your knowledge by experience, and it is possible that you will get your fingers burned in the process.

The danger of being "sold" is done away with if you deal with a really good firm which has a reputation to keep up. If you get a stamp from a known dealer which is not what it purports to be, you may be certain that he has been taken in himself; and as an expert dealer is and has to be very wide awake, this will seldom if ever happen.
