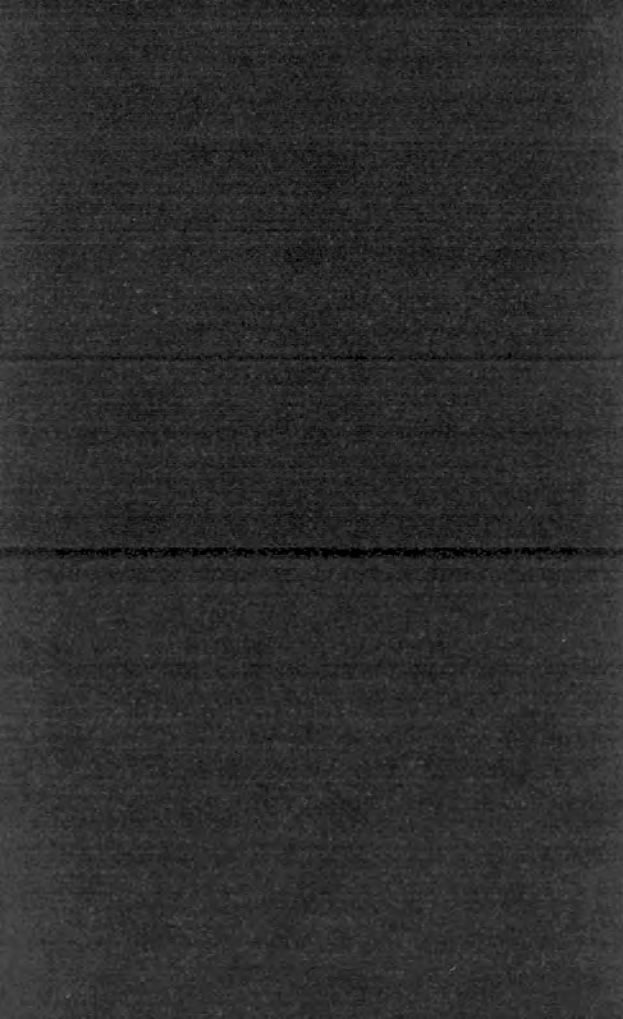

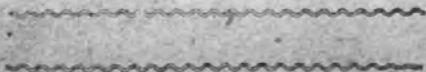

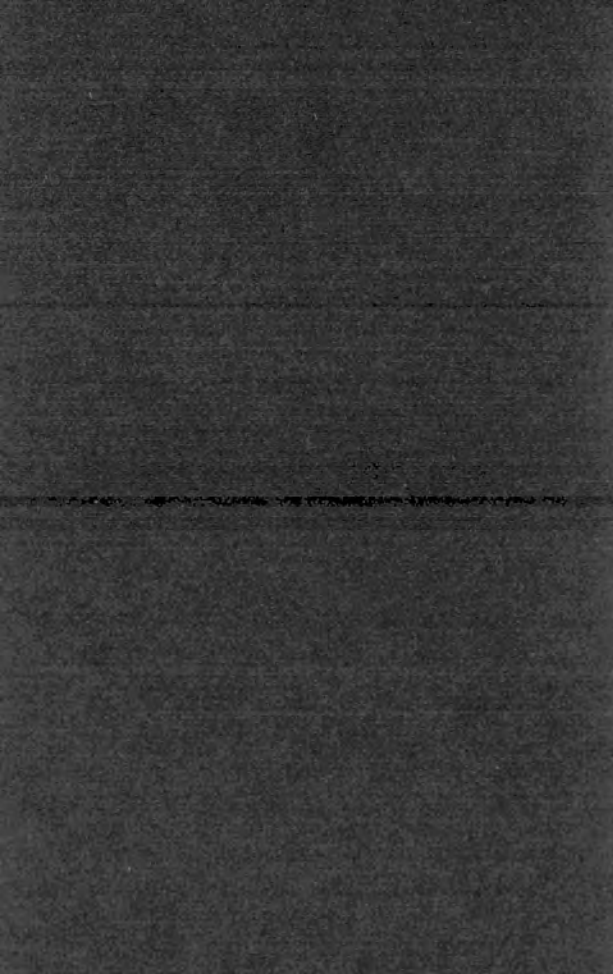

A Large Contribution.

A stingy old maid dropped two postage stamps into the contribution box. NEW ISSUES.

Portugal has also issued a new series bearing a portraite of King Manuel. The values range from 2 1-2 to 1000 reis making a total of 14,

Mexico is contemplating a commemorative issue of 7 stamps. The values from 1 to 15 cents, are to bear portraits of nobles in the struggle for inde-

pendence.

Greece also has a new issue coming. The series will be comprised of thirteen stamps ranging from 1 lepton to 5 dr. Most of the designs will be copied from their ancient coins. Somali Coast has a new series being of the same design as before, but larger in size as regards the "centime" values.

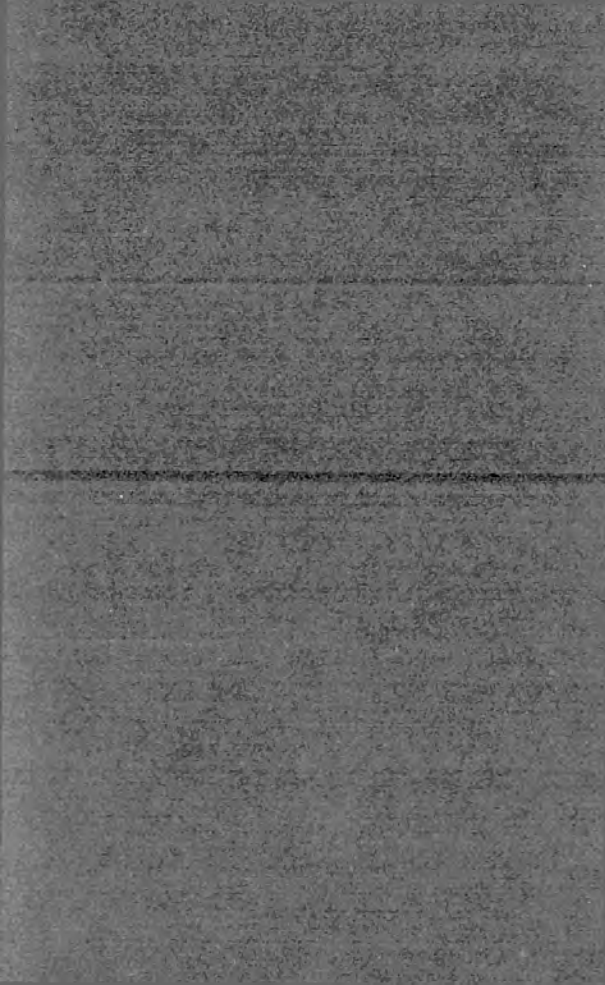

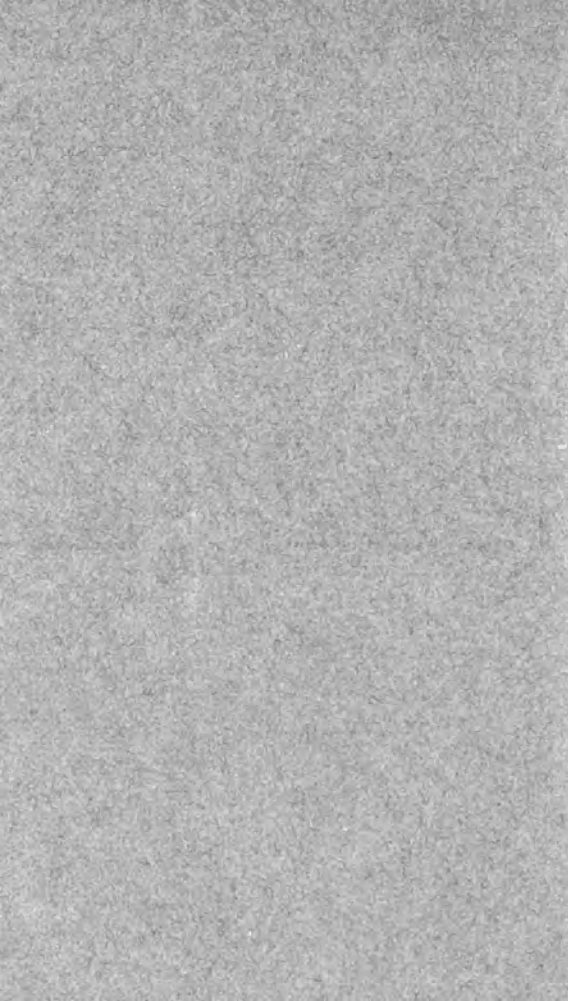

THE FIRST POSTAGE STAMPS.

The first postage stamps in the form of stamped envelopes were used by Mr. Velaye who owned a private post in France during the reign of Louis XIV

In 1858 M. de Chamouset, who also owned a private post, issued postage slips to be attached to letters. In Spain and India stamp covers for mail were also tried, but it was not until 1840 that

postage stamps, as we know them, were put into use. England first used them the government adopted the system devised by Rowland Hill.

Before this postage slip and post offices were operated in England as early as 1637.

Brazil was the next country to adopt the new plan, followed by Russia who opened post offices in 1844. The U. S. used stamps issued by privates as early as 1710. But in 1847 Congress authorized the issue of postage stamps. These were first five and ten cent stamps, but later the other values were added.

COMMEMORATIVE ISSUES.

The first postage stamp to bear the picture of Lincoln was issued in 1862. It was of the 15c denomination.

The stamps of Afghanistan are cancelled by cutting or tearing a piece from the stamp.

In 1885 there was a great eruption of one of the smaller volcanoes which destroyed the beautiful pink and white terraces of New Zealand. Good pictures of these are seen on four and nine pence stamps.

Uncle Sam or rather the Post Office Department will be asked, by the directors of the Ohio Valley Exposition, to issue a series of postage stamps commemorative of the great exposition in exploitation of the Ohio Valley and its products. It was decided at the meeting of the Board of Directors held March 1 to take the matter up with the P.O. Dep at once. It is believed that no trouble will meet with.

2 The Trans-Mississippi issue of 1898, issued to commemorate the opening and settlement of the Mississippi Valley and helped to advertise the exposition being held at Omaha Neb.

3 The Pan-American issue of 1901. These stamps were issued to show the different ways of travel and transportation through the country.

4 The Louisiana Purchase issue of 1904. To commemorate the purchase of the Louisiana territory.

5 The Jamestown issue of 1907. Issued to commemorate the founding and settlement of Jamestown V.

6 Lincoln Memorial issue of 1909. Commemorative of the 100th Anniversary of the Birth of Abraham Lincoln.

There has been two other issues during 1909 the Alaska-Yukon and Hudson Fulton.

By the time you have studied this article you will see the attraction that is attached to this particular branch of stamp collecting.

PHILTELIC FINDINGS

Postage stamp collecting as an amusement, is said to have begun in the year 1850 or as soon as it was noticed that stamps of values, colors and designs, were being received from different parts of the world.

The Seybold sale which was recently held in New York brought \$33,648.70.
