Beginning with 1890 the upper two stars are omitted on all but the 5-cent lithographed Bolivia, Peru and Chila have been changed by the result of war. Bolivia at present has nine departments or provinces, one star representing each on the arms of the nation. Two other detartments were added 1871 and lost about '90 as the stamps show .- Evergreen State Philatelist.
