## COIN COLLECTING.

For The Exchange.
After gaining a thorough knowledge of the coins of the United States and the American colonies, the young collector may turn his attention to coins of other countries with good success.

In acquiring nodern coins of foreign countries the aim of the collector should be simply to illustrate
the numerous coinages by select specimens struck in a special metal such as silver or copper.

Be sure to make yourself acquainted with the history of the sovereign or commonwealth under whose authority it was issued; recognize by certain characters or letters its place of mintage, its value, and so on until you know everything there is to know about it worth knowing.

Then write a short description of the coin, the date of purchase, and cost, on a neatly cut small piece of paper and plat - this under the coin in the cabinet.

After having thus filled several trays with modern coins of toreign countries and beconne alnost an export, if you still desire to enlarge your collection, or if you do not care to enter the field as a general colledor then one of the most interesting and fascinating branches of this captivating persuit is to become a specialist. A specialist is a collector who collects some particular coinage or denomination of coins until, after years of slow and patient efforts he possesses all the possible issues, types, and varieties of that coinage.

The collector who has made the persuit of coin-gathering his hobby will sooner or later drift into the collection of ancient coins of Greece and Rone.

These form a special class requiring special training and study, and are not generally treated or combined with modern coins. Still, appropriate room can be found in any ordinary cabinet for representative and easily obtainable coins of (Greck cities, of Sicily, Persia, Egypt and Judaca, or of Julins Cicsar, Au-
gustus and other early Roman Em. perors.

A small coin cabinet containing from ten to eighteen trays, eithcr partitioned or not, each about four. teen by sixteen inches will contains all these coins.

Coins, generally, should be ncither cleaned, oiled, nor rubbed, but simply placed in the cabinet and left alone. Still to remove grease spots and slight corrosion silver coins can be dipped for a few min. utes in "aqua ammonia" then wash. ed in warm water and dried. Cup, per coins may sometimes be slightly improved by being oiled, and after a couple of days carefully washed with soap and warm water.

If you do not want your collection to become a mere accumulation of dross do not collect medalecs. store and advertising cards, especially if struck in tin or white metal. Do not pay fancy prices for so-callax rarities to coin dealers solely on the latter's recommendation but fitm take the advice of a more experichced friend. Do not collect electrotypes of rare coins. They are ant an abomination in the eyes of cul. lectors. Indeed as far as fac-simile U. S. coins are concerned, their trat. fic is strictsy prohibited by law, and dealers who sell them to unsuspert tin8 collectors are lieble to healy putishment if detected.

Considerable information can tw rived from the various price-lists of dealers and more still from sale chi. alogues descriptive of coins and medals that are constantly being is sued and distributed by interested parties.

Literature alone will not, howes (T, make a good collector of cuins.

He must learn from personal expericnce. 'To succeed he must be paticnt, alert, and above all have a grmuine love for art, history, antiqtity, and all else which is discoveralle in the treasures that constitute al cal)inet of a mumismatist.

## MEXICOAND HERSTAMPS

Next to Central America on the morth, is Mexico. At present, Mexicu is a confederate republic of twen-ty-seven states, one territory, and othe federal district, with a form of wivernment modeled after that of [nited States. 'The railroads, telegraph, improved methods of communication, are the actual evidence , of the regeneration of Mexico. The first series of stamps appeared in 1856. Alvarez was then president, :lnd the "Constitution Congress" met February, 1856. The first stamps bore a portrait of the priest, Hilalgo, who with three other leadIns, tried to rid Mexico of her spanih oppressors. But in August i8in, 15 years before the stamps appeared, fin and his three friends were beluaded. Their heads were carried 10) (:llamajuata and placed upon the far curners of the Castle of Gremalitat. Next came the series of astr. Only two of this issue can ?1. comsiderd rare, the three centaus brown, and $1 / 2$ reals brown, they bear the Arms of Mexico, an ml. on a cactus killing a smake. Wher the Emperor Maximillian arsited, (June 12) his portrait appearaf on the stamps. After the French mwer, which had been established ill Vexico, was overthrown, old de-
signs appeared again. About this time the state of Guadalajara, need ing stamps, made something that can hardly be considered a stamp. It was like a common post-mark, and indeed it most certainly looked like one. This was in 1867. The provisional government which followed had the I real blue, $11 / 2$ real gray, $11 / 2$ real brown, 8 real green. and 8 real gray. Then came the series of 1868 and 1872 , the were of five varieties, $6,12,25,50$ and 100 centavos. The 50 centavos bluc error is now valued at $\$ 5.00$. In 1874-78 there was a series of stamped envelopes, 4 centavos, pale red. io centavos green and 25 centavos; blue. In 1879-82 we have the rors centavos black, 85 centavos purple. 50 centavos green, 25 centavos rose, 10 centavos brown, and the 2 centavos slate. Some of the above stamps are very rare. In 1884-88, the io peso blue, the 5 peso, 2 peso. i peso and the 5 centavos. Those of 1888 are from 1 centavos to 10 centavos. And now collest ors, should you want my advice, 1 would say obtain all the Mexican stamps you can, even if you shouldi have to pay a good price for them. They are sure to increase in valuc and form a complete and historic series. American collectors should pay great attention to the Mexican and Canadian stamps, as they are our next neghbors. M.

## WEST INDIAN STAMPS.

## CONTINUFD.

St. Helena first issued stamps in 1856. They were of one value only, and bore the head of the Queen. In value they were $6 p$. and the color blue.

St. Lacia issued stamps three years later. These stamps had no value, but were surcharged $1 p, 4 p$, and 6p. each, and in color lake, deep blue and deep green. In 1885 the design was changed, and the value was writted with the stamp. The only stamps that can be considered rare are the first three. The Uthers are within the reach of all young collectors,

St. Vincent issued stamps in 186i. In value 1 p . red and 6 p . green. live years later two more values were ackled, 4 p . dark blue, and tsiln. slate. The stamps all bore a picture of the Queen, and of the same values, and designs, until in r880-81 when they were slightly changed. The 6p. green was split
and each half was surcharged ip.
Tobago first issued stamps in 1870. They were of four values, and in color, carmine, blue, orange and green. In 1880 the $6 p$. orange was surcharge ip. and the stanpp was split. The only rare stamp is the If violet but any of the surcharges command a handsome sum.

Trinidad began in 185 I to issute stamps. The first bear the picture of Brittania, and range in value from ip. to ish. In 1883 the design was changed and the hearl which appears on all Englishstamps was placed thereon.

T'urk's Island first adopted stamps in 1867 . Their value was ip. and rsh., color red, vermilion and slate. In 1881 quite a large number of surcharges appeared, many of which of which are very hard to obtain.

Virgin Islands has on 17 stamps all told the first appearing in 1867. They were of four values, ip green, 4 p. red, 6 p . rose and $1 s h$. red and black and ish. with colored border. They bear a picture of the Virgin Mary and of late the one shillings with colored border has been sectio without the figure of the Madoma in the centre.

## FRANCE.

France has very few possessiont in the West Indies and can readiby be disposed of.

Guacleloupe issued its first stamps in 1884 . It was a surcharge of 20 centimes on the Fiench stanp of $3^{1}$ centimes. Most of these stanps command good prices as do some 18 the mpaid letter stamp of wich it issues a series of 12 .

Martinique adopted stamps ith 1884. They were all the Fiench

samps surcharged. It also has a has a series of 13 unpaid letter st tups.

## SPAIN.

Cuba dates its first stamp in I 855 and presents a long series of stamps. There are many rare ones and are wer laard to obtain. The stamps are of the general issue of Spain. [a 1873 the insurgents issued a : hamp of their own valued at 10 untavos on green paper. This - fanp was never used.
l'urto Rico began in 1873 to is, He stanps, a long series of no spesial attractions and few rarities. They bear the design which decothe the Spanish stamps.

## NE'THERIAND.

Netherland has but one possessint this group, Auracao, which presthts a series of 12 stamps, beginming with the issue of r873. None of these are rare except the 2 gld. and 50 c . bistre and violet which snes at $\$ 1.75$, the lighest price paid fir any. It also has a series of unpaici letter stamps.

## RI:PUBLICS.

Inminican Repulbic's first stamp appeared in 1862. The first were as suall square of rose paper, with fla arms stamped on, and value in italic letters of $1 / 2$ real, and 1 real wen paper. 'They command from lum: 55 to $\$ 35$. In i865 the value wis printed in Roman letters rial green paper, and I real straw 1pher, priced respectively at $\$ 25$ Ind $\mathrm{S}_{30}$. No other great rarity is i!! this series, but all the other - 1 mps are clifferent fiom the first unl larger in size.
