COLLECTOR'S COMPANION.

NEW ISSUES.

From "STAMP WORLD."

BAHAMAS.—Two high values have appeared, viz: a 5 shillings green, and a £1 brown. The design is similar to the one shilling green.

BAVARIA.—The watermark has been changed in the 3, 5 and 10 pf. cards.

BELGIUM.—A new 25 centimes stamp is announced. The color of the one centime is now pearl.

CEYLON.—The twenty-four cents has been changed in color to brown, and the two cents to green.

GAMBIA.—The *Monthly* states that a half penny reply card has been issued.

GOLD COAST.—The two pence has been changed to gray. This is the second change in the set, so we should not be surprised to see the colors of the other values changed.

HAWAII.—There are several sizes of the two and four cent envelopes.

LABUAN.—The *P. M.* states that it has received a sixteen cents surcharged by hand, with a pen, "One Dollar."

MEXICO.—Two new cards, a three centavo green and a ten centavo. Also an official envelope.

NEVIS.—The six-pence green of the new design has appeared.

NORWAY.—The *P. M.* announces that the twelve ore has been changed to red. It would be a great relief to see the ten ore in a new coat.

PARAGUAY.—As is the custom, cards generally follow a new design of adhesive. A two and three centavos of the present design have appeared.

RUSSIA.—A one kopeck yellow of the new series is now in use.

STS. SETTLEMENTS.—The five cents blue has been surcharged four cents, both in red and black. The color of the ½ penny has been changed from yellow to green.

SO. AUSTRALIA.—The arms in the design of the newspaper wrappers are smaller than formerly.

SHANGHAI.—The twenty cash violet has been changed to green, and the sixty cash to violet.

St. CHRISTOPHER.—The color of the four pence is gray instead of green.

URUGUAY.—The entire set has been surcharged for official use.
